Dear President Peevey and Commissioners,

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) thanks you for your attention and consideration of its application for the Tehachapi Renewable Transmission Project. Based on the discussion during last Friday's oral argument, SCE would like to highlight the following points from its Opening Comments to the Proposed Decision, submitted on November 23, 2009. SCE believes these are among the most important issues the Commission should consider in its evaluation of TRTP. Additionally, SCE provides the information requested by Commissioners Simon and Grueneich related to wind design standards and fire issues, respectively.

1. Alternative 4CM Would Substantially Delay Completion of the Project

Given all the additional regulatory, site, and construction issues that Alternative 4CM raises, Alternative 4CM would delay completion of the Project by at least 2 to 3.5 years. For the delay to be limited to 2 years, however, there would have to be:

- (1) no munitions and explosives of concern ("MEC") found on the Aerojet property;
- (2) no delays in the acquisition of the Aerojet property;
- (3) no delays in acquiring the other necessary agency approvals (from DTSC and the Parks and Recreation Commission);
- (4) no construction delays due to the instability of the site; and

- (5) no construction delays due to environmental restrictions relating to endangered species.¹

If any of these events occur, the resulting delay could extend to 3.5 years or more. By contrast, Segment 8A presents none of these delay risks. Given the imperative need for TRTP, the Commission should avoid the grave risk of delay created by Alternative 4CM and adopt the Proposed Decision, with the limited modifications set forth in SCE's comments.

2. The Commission Cannot Legally Require SCE to Implement the \$50 Million 21st Century Green Partnership Proposal

The Proposed Decision correctly finds that the 21st Century Green Partnership Proposal cannot be legally imposed. The mitigation measures included in the FEIR already mitigate Alternative 4CM's potential impacts to the Park to less than significant levels. Additionally, the 21st Century Green Partnership Proposal constitutes unlawful funding of future unspecified jobs and programs. Moreover, SCE has already committed to remove de-energized transmission lines from the park under a separate settlement agreement not related to Alternative 4CM. There is no connection (let alone one that is "roughly proportional") between Alternative 4CM and the proposed "mitigation." The FEIR makes this clear.²

Advocates of Alternative 4CM say on the one hand that it benefits the Park. On the other, they say that an additional \$50 million in mitigation is required. This is impermissible double dipping – plain and simple. It violates federal constitutional requirements and CEQA. As a result, SCE cannot legally be required to fund these measures.

3. Segment 8A Is Designed to Withstand Winds of at Least 89 mph.

SCE relies on decades of meteorological data to determine probable winds in the Chino Hills area, and the maximum statistical probable wind speed is approximately 72 mph. Each structure in Segment 8A is then designed with a safety factor of 1.5 over the maximum wind speed, meaning the structures are designed to withstand winds of at least 89 mph. By comparison, GO-95 requires a design wind speed of just 56 mph.³ If desired by the Commission, SCE can increase the safety factors incorporated into each tower's design to provide even further assurances of safety.

4. Segment 8A Would Not Increase Fire Risk to Chino Hills Residents, but Alternative 4CM Would Cause Significant Unmitigatable Fire Impacts in Chino Hills State Park.

As ALJ Kolakowski correctly notes in the Proposed Decision, Segment 8A would not impede firefighting activities in Chino Hills. Because Segment 8A uses existing right-of-way with an existing transmission line, the FEIR concluded that the increased height of towers only marginally affects firefighting effectiveness.⁴ It is also important to remember that fire-fighters effectively fight fires in cities across the country (like NYC and Chicago) in far more constrained areas than this, where they have to deal with elevated trains, transmission lines, lighting, etc.

By contrast, both the FEIR and the Proposed Decision find that Alternative 4CM results in new significant unmitigable fire impacts in Chino Hills State Park because it requires new and expanded right-of-way in approximately 8.3 miles in the high-risk Tehachapi fireshed and that Alternative 4CM significantly interferes with aerial and ground-based firefighting operations there.⁵

SCE strongly encourages the Commission to consider these important issues and to adopt the Proposed Decision, with the limited revisions described in SCE's Opening Comments.
