**MOTION OF THE VOTE SOLAR INITIATIVE FOR LEAVE TO FILE
CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL UNDER SEAL; CONFIDENTIAL MATERIAL
ATTACHED AND FILED UNDER SEAL**

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June 22, 2010

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The Vote Solar Initiative has filed separately today in the above captioned preceding a Notice of Intent to Claim Intervenor Compensation. Attached to that filing as Attachment 3 is the “FINANCIAL STATEMENT In Support of Notice of Intent to Claim Intervenor Compensation” of Mr. Jim Baak. Vote Solar respectfully moves that the personal financial information of Mr. Baak be submitted under seal.

GO 66-C excludes from public inspection “[r]ecords or information of a confidential nature furnished to, or obtained by the Commission.” Mr. Baak’s personal financial information is confidential in nature. Making it generally available for public inspection would unnecessarily intrude on his privacy. Commission Staff should be permitted to review this information to the extent necessary to support Mr. Baak’s showing of significant financial hardship. Mr. Baak recognizes that parties of record may also wish to review and comment on this information, to discover facts that might support related pleadings before the Commission. To accommodate such review, Mr. Baak consents to the Commission’s use of an appropriate nondisclosure agreement.

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ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE RULING

On June 22, 2010, the Vote Solar Initiative (“Vote Solar”) filed a Motion for Leave to File Confidential Material Under Seal to protect from public disclosure the personal financial information of Mr. Jim Baak, which was submitted in support of Vote Solar’s Notice of Intent to Claim Intervenor Compensation as Attachment 3 in the above captioned proceeding. Good cause having been shown, it is ruled that:

1. The information set forth in Attachment 3 of the Vote Solar Notice of Intent to Claim Intervenor Compensation submitted herein on July 22, 2010 is given confidential treatment under Section 583 of the Public Utilities Code and General Order No. 66-C. These exhibits shall remain under seal and not be accessible or disclosed to persons other than Commission Staff, the Commissioner and the Administrative Law Judge to who the above captioned proceeding is assigned, or the Administrative Law Judge then designated as the law and motion judge, except on further order or ruling of the Commission, the Administrative Law Judge, or the assigned Commissioner.
2. Interested parties other than Commission Staff, the Administrative Law Judge to whom the application is assigned, or the Administrative Law Judge then designated as the law and motion judge, may seek to permit qualified individuals to view the confidential materials upon the execution of a mutually agreed upon non-disclosure agreement with the Vote Solar Initiative, or on further order or ruling of the Commission, the Administrative Law Judge, or the assigned Commissioner. If Vote Solar and interested parties are not able to agree on a mutually acceptable

non-disclosure agreement, the parties shall bring the matter to the attention of the assigned Administrative Law Judge for resolution.
