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Pursuant to Rule 11.1 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) requests that the Commission shorten the time for responding to its *Motion of Pacific Gas and Electric Company to Strike Portions of the testimony of City and County of San Francisco (CCSF) and Marin Energy Authority (MEA) on the 2011 Energy Resources Recovery Account and Ongoing Competition Transition Charge (CTC)*, filed concurrently with this motion from 15 to 6 days for responses, or Monday, August 30. The reason for this shortened response period is to make it possible for the CPUC to issue a ruling on the Motion to Strike or otherwise provide guidance to PG&E and the Intervening parties by the beginning of hearings, which are set to start in this proceeding on September 1st. This request for a shortened response period is also designed to allow the CPUC to provide for guidance and clarity in identifying the issues that are within scope and what are out of scope in this proceeding, in an effort to allow the proceeding to proceed efficiently, and on schedule. Without this modified schedule, Commission response to PG&E's Motion to Strike would be due September 8th which would be after the hearings.

For the reasons set forth above, PG&E respectfully requests that protests and responses to PG&E's Motion to Strike be due 6 days from today, on Monday, August 30. PG&E also requests that the Assigned ALJ or Commissioner grant this motion as soon as possible, ideally before PG&E's rebuttal testimony must be served, if at all possible, if not, by the first day of hearings.
