**NOTICE OF INTENT OF THE GREENLINING INSTITUTE TO CLAIM INTERVENOR  
COMPENSATION**

**I. INTRODUCTION**

Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC" or "Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure 17.1 and Public Utilities Code Section § 1802, *et. seq.*, the Greenlining Institute ("Greenlining") respectfully files this Notice of Intent ("NOI") to claim compensation as an intervenor in the Order Instituting Rulemaking to Develop the Commission's Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan ("CEESP").

Greenlining requests a finding that it is a "customer" as defined in the Public Utilities Code, a finding of significant financial hardship, and a ruling that it is eligible for compensation. Greenlining timely files this NOI 27 days after the prehearing conference ("PHC") on July 18, 2008.

**II. IN THIS PROCEEDING, GREENLINING WILL REPRESENT RATEPAYER  
INTERESTS THAT ARE OTHERWISE UNREPRESENTED AND ADDRESS  
ISSUES NOT FOCUSED ON BY OTHER PARTIES**

Greenlining, with the support of its statewide coalition, will provide unique value in this proceeding as the *only* intervenor to combine legal and public policy expertise to represent the diverse perspectives and interests of California’s minority and low-income communities before the Commission.<sup>1</sup> Greenlining’s advocacy not only creates awareness regarding significant issues facing these often marginalized communities, but helps ensure that these communities have an active voice in our state’s regulatory affairs.<sup>2</sup> Further, given that these communities are often excluded from the regulatory decision-making process, Greenlining’s advocacy has the potential to mitigate the possibility that such exclusion will result in inequity or other harm. The possibility of such negative outcomes are particularly significant in this proceeding, where the Commission is proposing to move this proceeding along at such a breakneck pace.

As possible, Greenlining will seek to coordinate with other intervenors active in the proceeding, to avoid duplication under § 1804. As discussed in greater detail, *infra*, Greenlining plans to participate in all the remaining phases of the proceeding. This includes, but is not limited to, filing briefs when a proposed decision is issued. Through this participation, Greenlining will specifically address issues critical to low-income and minority ratepayers.

**III. GREENLINING QUALIFIES AS A CUSTOMER AND IS AUTHORIZED TO REPRESENT THE INTERESTS OF RESIDENTIAL AND SMALL BUSINESS CUSTOMERS BEFORE THIS COMMISSION**

Greenlining's members and constituents are consumers of electricity and related services from California's four major investor-owned utilities, thereby qualifying Greenlining to file its NOI as a "customer" pursuant to CPUC Code § 1802(b). In compliance with D. 98-04-059, Conclusion of Law 5 and Finding of Fact 12, Greenlining estimates that its members represent a constituency that is divided approximately 75%/25% between residential customers and small business customers, respectively.<sup>3</sup> Article II, Section 17, of Greenlining's by-laws authorizes it to represent the "interests of low income communities, minorities, and residential ratepayers" before regulatory agencies and courts.<sup>4</sup>

**IV. GREENLINING SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF COMMISSION CODE § 1701 AND § 1804**

**A. GREENLINING MEETS THE REQUIREMENT FOR TIMELY FILING**

By filing this NOI on August 14, 2008, 27 days following the PHC, Greenlining has met the requirement of Commission Rule 17.1(a)(1), which states that "A notice of intent to claim compensation may be filed in a proceeding in which a prehearing conference is held, any time after the start of the proceeding until 30 days after the prehearing conference."

**B. GREENLINING'S STATEMENT OF THE NATURE AND EXTENT OF ITS PARTICIPATION IN THIS PROCEEDING**

Greenlining plans to be involved in all phases of this rulemaking, and offers the following costs and time estimates, with the understanding that the hours are dependent on the scope of the contested issues and length of the case. Due to the far-reaching implications of the CEESP on California's energy

efficiency, the complex nature of this proceeding and the dozens of parties that have already filed comments, this proceeding has already required a significant investment of time on Greenlining's part.

As an intervenor, Greenlining has already participated in all aspects of this proceeding since the July 14, 2008 Ruling Regarding Initial Schedule on Strategic Plan ("Ruling"). This included: 1) attending and making an appearance at the PHC; 2) attending and making an appearance at the Public Workshop; 3) submitting Opening Comments on the draft CEESP; and 4) submitting Reply Comments on the draft CEESP.

Greenlining intends to fully participate in any remaining aspects of the proceeding, including, but not limited to, submitting opening and reply comments on the proposed decision.

The July 14 Ruling set forth several issues within the scope of this proceeding:

- 1) What strategies encompassed in the CEESP application should be adopted in a Commission Strategic Plan?
- 2) What strategies delineated in the CEESP application should be modified for adoption in a Commission Strategic Plan, and how?
- 3) What strategies not discussed in the CEESP application should be added and adopted in a Commission Strategic Plan?
- 4) What strategic roles should the Commission take in working with other governmental agencies and other non-jurisdictional stakeholders in support of a Commission Strategic Plan?
- 5) How should a Commission Strategic Plan coordinate energy efficiency plans with demand response plans and solar programs?

Greenlining submitted opening and reply comments addressing all of the above issues. Greenlining is prepared to address all of the above issues in its comments on a proposed decision.

### **C. ITEMIZED ESTIMATE OF COMPENSATION**

Pursuant to the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure 17.1(c), Greenlining provides an estimate of its expected budget for each of the above issues. In view of the uncertainty inherent in time and cost required by participating in this proceeding, the budget below is only the roughest estimate of the fees, expenses and time that Greenlining might incur in this proceeding:

- 1) What strategies encompassed in the CEESP application should be adopted in a Commission Strategic Plan? (10%)
- 2) What strategies delineated in the CEESP application should be modified for adoption in a Commission Strategic Plan, and how? (30%)
- 3) What strategies not discussed in the CEESP application should be added and adopted in a Commission Strategic Plan? (30%)
- 4) What strategic roles should the Commission take in working with other governmental agencies and other non-jurisdictional stakeholders in support of a Commission Strategic Plan? (20%)
- 5) How should a Commission Strategic Plan coordinate energy efficiency plans with demand response plans and solar programs? (10%)

Greenlining submits its proposed hourly rates for Greenlining's attorneys based on D.08-04-010, which set forth the hourly intervenor rates for 2008. The reasonableness of the proposed hourly rates for Greenlining's attorneys are supported by various factors including fair market rates, their experience, their areas of expertise, and their previous work before this Commission.

Greenlining estimates the following as a future request for compensation:

**D. PARTICIPATION IN THIS PROCEEDING WOULD POSE A SIGNIFICANT FINANCIAL HARDSHIP**

Pursuant to CPUC Code § 1804(a)(2)(B), Greenlining may show that participation in this proceeding would pose a significant financial hardship. Pursuant to CPUC Code §1804(b), a finding of significant financial hardship shall create a rebuttable presumption of eligibility for compensation in other CPUC proceedings commencing within one year of the date of that finding.

On March 17, 2008, the Commission found that Greenlining satisf[ie]d the requirements set forth in § 1804 of the Public Utilities Code and Rule 17.1 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure and thereby satisfied all the procedural requirements necessary to make its request for compensation.”<sup>6</sup> This included a finding that Greenlining met CPUC Code § 1804(a)(2)(B) requiring a showing of significant financial hardship.<sup>7</sup> Since the current rulemaking commenced within one year<sup>8</sup> of that finding, Greenlining requests that the rebuttable presumption of significant financial hardship apply here.

Greenlining does not anticipate any challenge to its eligibility for compensation in this proceeding. If any party does attempt to rebut the presumption of eligibility, however, Greenlining requests that it be granted the opportunity to reply to such party's allegations within 10 days after the service of such filing.

**V. CONCLUSION: GREENLINING SHOULD BE FOUND ELIGIBLE FOR INTERVENOR COMPENSATION IN THIS PROCEEDING**

Based on the above information, Greenlining respectfully submits that it has met the requirements established in Commission §§ 1802 and 1804 and Rule 17.1. Greenlining therefore requests a ruling finding Greenlining eligible for compensation in this proceeding.<sup>9</sup>

**I. BYLAWS**

**OF  
THE GREENLINING INSTITUTE**

**ARTICLE I  
PRINCIPAL OFFICE**

The principal office of this corporation shall be located in the City and County of San Francisco, California.

**ARTICLE II  
MEMBERSHIP**

This corporation shall have no voting members, but the Board of Directors may, by resolution, establish one or more classes of nonvoting members and provide for eligibility requirements for membership and rights and duties of members, including the obligation to pay dues.

**ARTICLE III  
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

Greenlining, recognizing the importance of maintaining a diversity of board members that reflects the age, ethnicity and gender of California's population, its constituency, may prioritize these groups for recruitment to the board but does not exclude any nominee regardless of age, race, gender or religion from consideration for nomination.

Section 1. Powers. This corporation shall have powers to the full extent allowed by law. All powers and activities of this corporation shall be exercised and managed by the Board of Directors of this corporation directly or, if delegated, under the ultimate direction of the Board.

Section 2. Number of Directors. The number of directors shall be not less than nine nor more than twenty-seven, with the exact number of authorized directors to be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Limitations on Interested Persons. At all times, not more than 49% of the directors of this corporation may be interested persons. An interested person means either:

- (a) any person currently being compensated by this corporation for services rendered to it within the previous twelve months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a director in his or her capacity as a director; or
- (b) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendant, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of any such person.

**Section 4. Term of Office of Directors.** Except for the Executive Director, who shall serve on the Board of Directors *ex officio*, the directors of this corporation shall be designated for a term of two years. Directors may serve consecutive terms as long as they are re-nominated and re-elected. A aye vote of two-thirds of sitting directors is required to be elected.

**Section 5. Vacancies.** A vacancy shall be deemed to exist on the Board if the actual number of directors is less than the authorized number for any reason. The sitting board of directors shall carry out nominations and elect new members. Vacancies are filled by election of the majority of sitting directors.

**Section 6. Resignation and Removal.** Resignations shall be effective upon receipt in writing by the Secretary of this corporation, unless a later effective date is specified in the resignation. The Board of Directors may remove any director at any meeting, with or without cause, on the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the directors then in office.

**Section 7. Annual Meetings.** A meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at least once a year. Annual meetings shall be called by either Co-Chair or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 9.

When hotel accommodations have been arranged for Board meetings, it will be the responsibility of the Board Member to cancel his or her reservation within 48 hours or the time required by the hotel if unable to attend the meeting. Any hotel charges incurred as a result of a “no show” by a Board Member, it will be the responsibility of that Board Member to pay the hotel charges.

**Section 8. Special Meetings.** Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by either Co-Chair, or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 9.

**Section 9. Notice.** Notice of the annual meeting and any special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given to each director at least four days before any such meeting if given by first-class mail or 48 hours before any such meeting if given personally or by telephone, telegraph, or facsimile transmission, and shall state the date, place, and time of the meeting.

**Section 10. Waiver of Notice.** The transactions of any meeting of the Board of Directors, however called and noticed or wherever held, shall be valid as though taken at a meeting duly held after regular call and notice if a quorum is present, and if, either before or after the meeting, each of the directors not present signs a written waiver of notice, a consent to holding the meeting, or an approval of the minutes. The waiver of notice or consent need not specify the purpose of the meeting. all waivers, consents and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting. Notice of a meeting shall also be deemed given to any director who attends the meeting without protesting the lack of adequate notice before the meeting or at its commencement.

**Section 11. Quorum.** One-third of the directors then in office shall constitute a quorum. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in Article III, Section 12; Article V, Section 1; Article VI, Section 3; Article VII, Section 2; Article VII, Section 2; and Article VIII, Section 4, of these Bylaws or in the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business notwithstanding

the withdrawal of directors, if any action taken is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for such meeting.

**Section 12. Action Without a Meeting.** Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board shall individually or collectively consent to such action. such written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board. Such written consents shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of such directors.

**Section 13. Telephone Meetings.** Directors may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephones or similar communications equipment so long as all directors participating in such meeting can hear one another. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this Section constitutes presence in person at such meeting.

**Section 14. Standard of Care.**

**A. General.** A director shall perform the duties of a director, including duties as a member of any Board Committee on which the director may serve, in good faith, in a manner such director believes to be in the best interest of this corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like situation would use under similar circumstances.

In performing the duties of a director, a director shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by:

- (i) one or more officers or employees of the corporation whom the director believes to be reliable and competent as to the matters presented;
- (ii) counsel, independent accountants, or other persons as to matters which the director believes to be within such person's professional or expert competence; or
- (iii) a Board Committee upon which the director does not serve, as to matters within its designated authority, provided that the director believes such Committee merits confidence;

so long as in any such case, the director acts in good faith after reasonable inquiry when the need therefor is indicated by the circumstances and without knowledge that would cause such reliance to be unwarranted.

Except as provided in Article VI below, a person who performs the duties of a director in accordance with this Section shall have no liability based upon any failure of alleged failure to discharge that person's obligations as a director, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any actions or omissions which exceed or defeat a public or charitable purpose to which a corporation, or assets held by it, are dedicated.

**B. Investments.** Except with respect to assets held for use or used directly in carrying out this corporation's charitable activities, in investing, reinvesting, purchasing or

acquiring, exchanging, selling, and managing this corporation's investments, the Board shall avoid speculation, looking instead to the permanent disposition of the funds, considering the probable income as well as the probable safety of this corporation's capital. No investment violates this section where it conforms to provisions authorizing such investment contained in an instrument or agreement pursuant to which the assets were contributed to this corporation.

Section 15. **Inspection.** Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect and copy all books, records, and documents, and to inspect the physical properties of this corporation.

Section 16. **Compensation.** Directors shall serve without compensation for their services as directors, provided that the reimbursement or advance of reasonable actual expenses incurred by a director in the performance of his or her duties shall not be prohibited by this Section.

Section 17. **Representing the Interest of Residential Ratepayers.** This corporation authorizes its Executive Director in consultation with the Executive Committee to intervene before state and federal regulatory agencies and courts to represent the interests of low income communities, minorities and residential ratepayers, including but not limited to users of electricity, telecommunication services, gas and water.

Section 18. **Fundraising.** The Board of Directors, recognizing their responsibility to contribute to fundraising and their limitations to personally contribute, hereby resolve to contribute best faith efforts towards the following:

- Personally contribute \$1,000 or more every four (4) years.
- Attend funding meetings with Staff and foundations when requested.
- Develop and identify fundraising opportunities.
- Recruit 10 attendees (1 table) for the Annual Summit.
- Assist in mitigating Greenlining expenses when possible.

Section 19. **Founding Emeritus Board.** Greenlining honors and recognizes the courageous and outstanding leadership efforts of the founding Board of Directors. Greenlining will create a "Founding Emeritus Board" to recognize outgoing board members for their hard work and sacrifice in developing the strongest multi-ethnic organization in the country. Founding Emeritus Board Members will be:

- Listed on the Greenlining stationery letterhead;
- Invited to attend board meetings;
- Invited to the annual economic summit; and
- Will be recognized when appropriate at key events and functions.

#### ARTICLE IV COMMITTEES

Section 1. **Board Committees.** The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, create any number of Board Committees, each consisting of two or more directors, to serve at the pleasure of the Board. Appointments to any Board

Committee shall be made by any method determined by a majority vote of the directors then in office. Board Committees may be given all the authority of the Board, except for the powers to:

- (a) set the number of directors within a range specified in these Bylaws;
- (b) fill vacancies on any Board Committee;
- (c) remove any director without cause;
- (d) fix compensation of directors for serving on the Board or any Board Committee;
- (e) amend or repeal these Bylaws or adopt new Bylaws;
- (f) adopt amendments to the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation;
- (g) amend or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (h) create any other Board Committees or appoint the members of any Board Committees; or
- (i) approve any merger, reorganization, voluntary dissolution, or disposition of substantially all of the assets of this corporation.

Where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain approval of the Board before entering into a self-dealing transaction, a Board Committee may approve such transaction in a manner consistent with the requirements of Section 3 of Article VI of these Bylaws; provided that, at its next meeting, the full Board determines in good faith that the Board Committee's approval of the transaction was consistent with the requirements in Section 3 of Article V and that it was not reasonably practical to obtain advance approval by the full Board, and ratifies the transaction by a majority of the directors then in office without the vote of any interested director.

**Section 2. Advisory Committees.** The Board of Directors may establish one or more Advisory Committees to the Board. The members of any Advisory Committee may consist of directors or non-directors and may be appointed as the Board determines.

**Section 3. Meetings.**

- A. **Of Board Committees.** Meetings and actions of Board Committees shall be governed by and held and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article III of these Bylaws concerning meetings and actions of the Board of Directors, with such changes in the content of those Bylaws as are necessary to substitute the Board Committee and its members for the Board of Directors and its members. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of any Board Committee and shall be filed with the corporate records.
- B. **Of Advisory Committees.** Advisory Committees shall determine their own meeting rules and whether minutes shall be kept.

The Board of Directors may adopt rules for the governance of any Board or Advisory Committee not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

## ARTICLE V OFFICERS

Section 1. **Officers.** The elected officers of this corporation shall be two Co-Chairs of the Board, a Secretary, a Treasurer and a member at-large. This corporation shall have an Executive Director appointed by the Board, and may also have, at the discretion of the directors, such other officers as may be appointed by the Board of Directors. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the Secretary nor the Treasurer may serve concurrently as the President or a Co-Chair of the Board, if any.

Section 2. **Election or Appointment.** The elected officers of this corporation shall be elected at the annual meeting in odd-numbered years by the Board of Directors to a two-year term. The Executive Director shall be appointed by the vote of a majority of the directors then in office, without term. All officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment.

Section 3. **Removal.** Subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed, with or without cause, by the Board of Directors or by an officer on whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. **Resignation.** Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Secretary or President of this corporation. Any resignation shall take effect on receipt of that notice by the Secretary or at any later time specified by that notice and, unless otherwise specified in that notice, the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. Any resignation is without prejudice to the rights, if any, of this corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.

Section 5. **Vacancies.** A vacancy in any office for any reason shall be filled in the same manner as these Bylaws provide for election to that office, for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 6. **Co-Chairs.** The Co-Chairs shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board of these Bylaws.

Section 7. **Executive Director.** The Executive Director shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation and shall, subject to control of the Board, generally supervise, direct, and control the business and other officers of this corporation. The Executive Director shall be a member of all Board Committees and shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of Executive Director, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.

Section 8. **Secretary.** The Secretary shall supervise the keeping of a full and complete record of the proceedings of the directors, shall supervise the giving of such notices as may be proper or necessary, shall supervise the keeping of the minute books of this corporation, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.

**Section 9. Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall supervise the charge and custody of all funds of this corporation, the deposit of such funds in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors, and the keeping and maintaining of adequate and correct accounts of this corporation's properties and business transactions, shall render reports and accounting as required, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.

## ARTICLE VI PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

**Section 1. Loans.** Without the approval of the Attorney General of California, this corporation shall not make any loans of money or property to, or guarantee the obligation of, any director or officer; provided, however, that this corporation may advance money to a director or officer of this corporation or any subsidiary for expenses reasonably anticipated to be incurred in performance of the duties of such officer or director so long as such individual would be entitled to be reimbursed for such expenses absent that advance.

**Section 2. Self-Dealing Transactions.** Except as provided in Section 3 below, the Board of Directors shall not approve or permit the corporation to engage in any self-dealing transaction. A self-dealing transaction is a transaction to which this corporation is a party and in which one or more of its directors has a material financial interest, unless the transaction comes within California Corporations Code Section 5233(b).

**Section 3. Approval.** This corporation may engage in a self-dealing transaction if the transaction is approved by a court or by the Attorney General. This corporation may also engage in a self-dealing transaction if the Board determines, before the transaction, that (1) this corporation is entering into the transaction for its own benefit; (2) the transaction is fair and reasonable to this corporation at the time; and (3) after reasonable investigation, the Board determines that it could not have obtained a more advantageous arrangement with reasonable effort under the circumstances. Such determinations must be made by the Board in good faith, with knowledge of the material facts concerning the transaction and the director's interest in the transaction, and by a vote of a majority of the directors then in office, without counting the vote of the interested director or directors.

## ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

**Section 1. Right of Indemnity.** To the fullest extent allowed by Section 5238 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, this corporation shall indemnify and advance expenses to its agents, in connection with any proceeding, and in accordance with Section 5238. For purposes of this Article, "agent" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including directors, officers, employees, other agents, and persons formerly occupying such positions; "proceeding" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including any threatened action or investigation under Section 5233 or brought by the Attorney General; and "expenses" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including reasonable attorneys' fees.

**Section 2. Approval of Indemnity.** On written request to the Board of Directors in each specific case by any agent seeking indemnification, to the extent that the agent has been

successful on the merits, the Board shall promptly authorize indemnification in accordance with Section 5238(d). Otherwise, the Board shall promptly determine, by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who are not parties to the proceeding, whether, in the specific case, the agent has met the applicable standard of conduct stated in Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c), and, if so, shall authorize indemnification.

**Section 3. Advancing Expenses.** To the fullest extent allowed by Section 5238 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, and except as otherwise determined by the Board of Directors in specific instances, the Board shall authorize the advance of expenses incurred by or on behalf of an agent of this corporation in defending any proceeding prior to final disposition, if the Board finds that:

- (a) the requested advances are reasonable in amount under the circumstances; and
- (b) before any advance is made, the agent will submit a written undertaking satisfactory to the Board to repay the advance unless it is ultimately determined that the agent is entitled to indemnification for the expenses under this Article.

Unless the Board finds compelling reasons to do otherwise, the undertaking shall be unsecured, and no interest shall be charged on the obligation created thereby.

**Section 4. Insurance.** The Board of Directors may adopt a resolution authorizing the purchase of insurance on behalf of any agent against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such, and such insurance may provide for coverage against liabilities beyond this corporation's power to indemnify the agent under law.

## ARTICLE VIII MISCELLANEOUS

**Section 1. Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of this corporation shall end each year on December 31.

**Section 2. Contracts, Notes, and Checks.** All contracts entered into on behalf of this corporation must be authorized by the Board of Directors or any person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board, and except as otherwise provided by law, every check, draft, promissory note, money order, or other evidence of indebtedness of this corporation shall be signed by any person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board.

**Section 3. Annual Reports to Directors.** Within 120 days after the end of this corporation's fiscal year, the Co-Chairs shall furnish a written report to all directors of this corporation containing the following information:

- (a) the assets and liabilities, including the trust funds of this corporation, has of the end of the fiscal year;
- (b) the principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds, during the fiscal year;

- (c) the revenue or receipts of this corporation, both unrestricted and restricted for particular purposes, for the fiscal year;
- (d) the expenses or disbursements of this corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, for the fiscal year;
- (e) any transaction during the previous fiscal year involving Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) or more between this corporation and any of its directors or officers, and the amount and circumstances of any indemnification or advances aggregating more than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) paid during the fiscal year to any director or officer of this corporation. The report must disclose the names of the interested persons involved in such transaction, stating such person's relationship to this corporation, the nature of such person's interest in the transaction and, where practicable, the value of such interest.

The foregoing report shall be accompanied by any report thereon of independent accountants or, if there is no such report, the certificate of an authorized officer of this corporation that such statements were prepared without an audit from the books and records of this corporation.

**Section 4. Amendments.** Proposed amendments to these Bylaws shall be submitted in writing to the directors at least one week in advance of the Board meeting at which they will be considered for adoption. The vote of two-thirds of the directors present at any meeting or the unanimous written consent of the directors shall be required to adopt a bylaw amendment.

**Section 5. Governing Law.** In all matters not specified in these Bylaws, or in the event these Bylaws shall not comply with applicable law, the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law as then in effect shall apply.

**Section 6. Fiscal Agent.** Greenlining, recognizing a responsibility to assist new organizations serving a similar constituency as Greenlining's, will, when appropriate without risk to Greenlining's non-profit status or reputation, will act as a temporary fiscal agent for:

- **Burgeoning community organizations that have applied for or will soon (2 months) receive their own 501(c)(3) non-profit status.**
- **A time period not to exceed 18 months.**
- **Organizations that pay for the necessary additional accounting costs.**
- **Organizations approved by the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors.**
- **Applications/requests approved by the organization's General Counsel.**
