**ASSIGNED COMMISSIONER'S RULING ON
DRAFT STRATEGIC LIGHTING PLAN**

California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Decision (D.) 09-09-047 directed the Energy Division (ED) to create a lighting chapter for inclusion in the California Long-term Energy Efficiency Strategic Plan (Plan), which was adopted in D.08-09-040.¹ In particular, ED was directed to include specific goals, strategies and milestones in the lighting chapter for transformation of the lighting market in California, and to solicit the input of key stakeholders through meetings and/or public workshops.

In December 2008, ED launched the process to develop the lighting chapter with a meeting of stakeholders to address advanced lighting technologies and best practices. Over the course of the next year, ED held five additional public workshops focused on developing the vision, goals, strategies, and milestones for lighting to achieve the goals of the Strategic Plan. These workshops engaged more than 100 stakeholders from over 60 organizations, representing the State's investor-owned utilities and lighting stakeholders such as manufacturers,

contractors, labor, technology researchers, environmental groups, local government representatives, and others. The draft lighting chapter is attached hereto as Attachment 1.

This ruling directs interested parties to participate in a proceeding to review and approve the draft lighting chapter according to the schedule set forth below.

If approved by the Commission, consistent with D.09-09-047, the new lighting chapter will be adopted as an addendum to the Plan, thereby amending Appendix A to D.08-09-040. No other changes to D.08-09-040 are anticipated.

IT IS RULED that:

1. The schedule for this proceeding is as set forth in this ruling. The assigned Administrative Law Judge may make any revisions to this schedule as deemed necessary for the fair and efficient management of the proceeding.

2. Parties may file Comments and Reply Comments no later than July 16, 2010 and July 23, 2010 respectively.
