**AMENDMENT TO SCOPING MEMO RULING
REVISING PROCEEDING SCHEDULE**

In reviewing the record of this proceeding to wrap up this proceeding, it appears that there might be some room for the parties¹ to work together cooperatively and maybe even informally to share their expertise and insights toward a refining the detailed provisions and arriving at a more effective and collaborative compromise language for some or many of the proposed general order provisions. Review of the comments and the report submitted by the Commission's Consumer Safety and Protection Division (CPSD) show that the parties have been actively engaged and continue to bring valuable experience and insight that could further contribute to a dialogue that would likely enhance the provisions of the recommended general order provisions before the decision is issued and the proceeding is closed.

¹ Party status is for those planning to actively participate in this rulemaking through, at a minimum, submission of written comments on the questions raised in the Preliminary Scoping Memo. State service status is for employees of the State of California who will not be submitting comments. Information Only status is for those who wish to follow the proceeding and receive documents associated with it, but who will not be actively participating.
