Pak concluded by indicating that Sempra believes the State would be better served by focusing on forward-looking issues affecting regional energy markets, thereby restoring the industry's traditional partnership with regulatory agencies.

**Summary:** On June 10, 2004, Lad Lorenz, Vice President – Regulatory Affairs for San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E), met with Ross LaJeunesse, advisor to Cmmr. Kennedy, in San Francisco. Also present was Billy Blattner, CPUC Relations Manager for SDG&E. Lorenz stated that the Commission must approve the project as proposed by SDG&E on July 8, 2004, in order to meet a June 2006 in-service date. Lorenz explained that any additional delays will push the in-service date beyond the summer of 2006 and cost ratepayers millions of dollars. Blattner stated that the project as proposed by SDG&E will be constructed in an existing transmission corridor and should be adopted as proposed without costly underground segments suggested in the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) that will delay the project. Blattner argued that the EIR inappropriately weighted minor visual concerns over all other environmental impacts and did not account for the feasibility or cost of the route changes or mitigation measures proposed therein. Lorenz added that the cost cap in the draft decision neglected to include the \$6.4 million cost of one of the underground segments proposed in the EIR.
