**Summary:** On July 13, 2004, Yvette Hogue, Executive Director-Regulatory Proceedings, Pacific Bell Telephone Company dba SBC California (SBC), met with **Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Kennedy**, in San Francisco. **Also present was Michael Sasser, Senior Counsel, SBC West. SBC representatives**

stated that the alternate decision (AD) should clarify that Appendices A, G, H, I and J are only for illustrative purposes and do not reflect the GAAP timing of adjustments ordered in the decision. **SBC representatives** further stated that Conclusion of Law 28 should be modified. **SBC representatives** also explained that the AD's Findings of Fact 67-69 and Conclusion of Law 36 should be deleted and that the AD should further clarify that the components of rate base are those previously ordered by the Commission. **SBC** argued that much of the AD's discussion of disputes over information requests is unnecessary and could be misconstrued. **SBC representatives** added that the AD's discussion of the allocation of customer service expenses includes an unnecessary discussion of expenses incurred for marketing telephone services in Verizon's territory.
