Summary: LATE FILED. On October 10, 2006, Brian Cherry, Vice President, Regulatory Relations, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), met with Rami Kahlon, advisor to Pres. Peevey, in San Francisco. Also present were Aaron Johnson, Deputy Director, and Frank Ghazzagh, Regulatory Analyst, for the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA), and Ray Williams, Director, Long-Term Energy Policy and Planning, for PG&E.
