SUBJECT: Order authorizing G. Perry Manley, dba Argonaut Heights Subdivision to increase his rate for sewer service.

WHEREAS: G. Perry Manley, dba ARGONAUT HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION, by Advice Letter No. 2, filed April 11, 1974, requests authority under General Order No. 96-A, Section VI, and Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase his rate for sewer service in Amador County, and

WHEREAS: The Commission is of the opinion, after investigation by its staff, that the requested rate increase is reasonable,

THE COMMISSION FINDS that the rate increase hereby authorized is justified and that the present rate is, for the future, unjust and unreasonable,

IT IS ORDERED that G. Perry Manley, dba Argonaut Heights Subdivision, is authorized to make effective the revised rate schedule attached to Advice Letter No. 2 and on the effective date authorized herein to cancel the presently effective rate schedule for sewer service. The effective date of the revised rate schedule shall be June 1, 1974.

TO THE CUSTOMERS OF G. PERRY MANLEY, DBA ARGONAUT HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION

This is further in response to your recent letter relative to the request of G. P. Manley, dba Argonaut Heights Subdivision for authority to increase the charge for sewer service.

Our staff has concluded its investigation of this matter and, based upon this study and its conclusion, the Commission has authorized the requested increase to become effective June 1, 1974. The staff's analysis of the utility's operations shows that the authorized increase will only reduce present operating losses from about \$3,000 to about \$1,000 per year. With these losses and in fairness to the utility, we have no recourse but to approve the requested increase.

The Commission appreciates your cooperation in writing us about this matter.
