SUBJECT: Order authorizing Citizens Utilities Company of California to deviate from the fire flow provisions of Rule No. 15, Main Extensions, and General Order No. 103, Section III, 2a and Section VIII Fire Protection Standards at Ethan Way and Hallmark Drive, Sacramento District, Sacramento County.

WHEREAS: CITIZENS UTILITIES COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA by Advice Letter No. 121 received September 10, 1975, requests authority to deviate from its Rule No. 15, Main Extensions and General Order No. 103, Section III and Section VIII, Fire Flow Standards at Ethan Way and Hallmark Drive, Sacramento District by not providing the fire flow stipulated for light commercial units, and

WHEREAS: General Order No. 103 requires 2,000 gpm for land use by light commercial, but the fire authority of the Arden Fire Protection District states that 750 gpm is all that they require at this point, and

WHEREAS: Developer states hardship on the grounds that if 2,000 gpm is required, he will be obliged to pay for extensions from two directions and would make the project uneconomical.

THE COMMISSION FINDS that the deviation from the fire flow requirements of Rule No. 15 and General Order No. 103 will not be adverse to the public interest and is justified.

IT IS ORDERED that Citizens Utilities Company of California be authorized to deviate from Rule No. 15, Main Extensions and General Order No. 103, Section III, 2a and Section VIII fire flow standards as proposed in its Advice Letter No. 121.
