**SUBJECT:** Order authorizing Thomas and Bayne Ditch Company to revise and modify its Rate Schedule No. 3M, Measured Irrigation Service from a commodity type rate structure to a facility type rate structure.

**WHEREAS:** THOMAS AND BAYNE DITCH COMPANY by Advice Letter No. 3, received December 9, 1974, requests authority to revise and modify its Schedule No. 3M, Measured Irrigation Service, from a commodity rate structure to a facility type rate structure eliminating the two classes of service and replacing it with only one, and

**WHEREAS:** Customers taking water service for the full irrigation season under the new service will not receive an increase in rates; customers taking water service during less than the full irrigation period may receive an increase in rates, and

**WHEREAS:** The type of service within the area served by the utility is changing from agricultural to residential use and the demand for agricultural service is being reduced and service to small parcels is uneconomical. The schedule will be closed after May 1, 1975, to all customers not taking service in the prior irrigation season.

**THE COMMISSION FINDS** that the change in rate form and the closing of the schedule is justified and reasonable,

**IT IS ORDERED** that Thomas and Bayne Ditch Company is authorized to make the necessary changes in its Schedule No. 3M, irrigation service as transmitted with Advice Letter No. 3.
