This amended Application will replace, in its entirety, SDG&E's April 13, 2015, Application. The second amended Application seeks approval to change electric rates. The changes requested in the second amended Application may lead to rate increases for certain electric customers and decreases for other electric customers. The second amended Application proposes no changes to total revenue or gas rates.

In this second amended Application, SDG&E proposes to update how various costs related to electric distribution (the process of distributing energy at the local level, including to your home), electric generation (the cost of electricity), and public purpose programs (such as low income and energy efficiency programs) are assigned to different customer classes. For electric distribution and generation costs, SDG&E is proposing to phase in these changes over a three-year period to minimize the impact to customers.



On February 9, 2016, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) filed a second amended General Rate Case (GRC) Phase 2 Application (Application) with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). The second amended application makes limited changes to the amended application that was filed December 1, 2015. These changes were made to reflect the results of other CPUC proceedings. This second amended application will replace in its entirety SDG&E's April 13, 2015, Application. The second amended Application seeks approval to change electric rates. The changes requested in the second amended Application may lead to rate increases for certain electric customers and decreases for other electric customers. The second amended Application proposes no changes to total revenue or gas rates.

In this second amended Application, SDG&E proposes to update how various costs related to electric distribution (the process of distributing energy at the local level, including to your home), electric generation (the cost of electricity), and public purpose programs (such as low income and energy efficiency programs) are assigned to different customer classes. For electric distribution and generation costs, SDG&E is proposing to phase in these changes over a three-year period to minimize the impact to customers.

In addition, SDG&E proposes to (1) gradually move toward rates that better reflect the cost of providing service for non-residential customers; (2) provide new rate options for primarily business customers; (3) update its electric sales forecast; and (4) change the time periods for all Time-of-Use (TOU) rates.

TOU rates price electricity according to when (season and time of day) a customer uses electricity. The price of electricity is higher when electric demand is higher. For TOU periods, the greatest demand on the electric grid is referred to as the on-peak period; lower rates are charged during the off-peak period. How and when SDG&E customers use electricity is changing. To more accurately reflect these changes, SDG&E is proposing to update its TOU periods to better reflect actual system conditions, as summarized in the table below:

*Represents SDG&E's current standard TOU time periods. Various optional rates have different TOU time periods than the standard.

SDG&E is also proposing a change to its Critical Peak Pricing (CPP) event hours which are currently from 11am to 6pm year round. If approved, the CPP would change to 2pm to 6pm year round. CPP is a rate in which prices can be adjusted on short notice so that SDG&E can respond to unusual system conditions. Higher rates are charged during event hours on a CPP event day. It provides participating customers an incentive to shift usage to non-event hours.

ESTIMATED IMPACT OF THIS REQUEST ON ELECTRIC RATES

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kWh per month will see a monthly winter bill increase of \$7.64, or 7.1%, from current Year 1, \$2.01, or 1.8% from Year 2, and \$1.24, or 1.1%, from Year 2 to Year 3. A typical monthly electric bill will increase from \$106.89 to \$114.53 from current to Year 1, and \$116.54 for Year 2, and \$117.76 for Year 3. The dollar amounts and percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the exact changes you may see in your bill. Changes in individual bills will depend on how much energy each customer uses. SDG&E is projecting that generally medium/large commercial and industrial customers as well as agricultural customers will see a decrease in their monthly electric bills as a result of this second amended Application. However, this projection is based on averages. Individual customers could see increases or decreases depending on electric usage. Table 1 below shows a comparison of current class average rates to proposed rates for Years 1, 2, and 3.

This Application is assigned to an Administrative Law Judge (Judge) who will determine how to receive evidence and other related documents, necessary for the CPUC to establish a record upon which to base its decision. Evidentiary hearings may be held where parties of record will present their testimony and may be subject to cross-examination by other parties. These evidentiary hearings are open to the public, but only those who are parties of record can participate.

After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned Judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt SDG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon at a scheduled CPUC Voting Meeting.

As a party of record, the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) will review this application. ORA is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a legislative mandate to represent investor-owned utility customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. 

If approved, the CPP would change to 2pm to 6pm year round. CPP is a rate in which prices can be adjusted on short notice so that SDG&E can respond to unusual system conditions. Higher rates are charged during event hours on a CPP event day. It provides participating customers an incentive to shift usage to non-event hours.

ESTIMATED IMPACT OF THIS REQUEST ON ELECTRIC RATES

If the CPUC approves SDG&E's request, a typical residential customer living in the inland climate zone and using 500 kWh per month will see a monthly winter bill increase of \$7.64, or 7.1%, from current to Year 1, \$2.01, or 1.8% from Year 1 to Year 2, and \$1.24, or 1.1%, from Year 2 to Year 3. A typical monthly electric bill will increase from \$108.89 to \$114.53 from current to Year 1, and \$116.54 for Year 2, and \$117.78 for Year 3. The dollar amounts and percentages shown do not necessarily reflect the exact changes you may see in your bill. Changes in individual bills will depend on how much energy each customer uses. SDG&E is projecting that generally medium/large commercial and industrial customers as well as agricultural customers will see a decrease in their monthly electric bills as a result of this second amended Application. However, this projection is based on averages. Individual customers could see increases or decreases depending on electric usage. Table 1 below shows a comparison of current class average rates to proposed rates for Years 1, 2, and 3.


