**LATE-FILED NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION OF ENERNOC, INC.**

Pursuant to Rule 8.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, EnerNOC, Inc., hereby gives late-filed notice of the following ex parte communication.

The communication occurred at 2:25 p.m. on Wednesday, April 20, 2016. The communication was oral and took place at the Commission's offices at 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, California 94102.

The communication was initiated by Mona Tierney-Lloyd, Senior Director, Western Regulatory Affairs, for EnerNOC, with Matthew Tisdale, advisor to Commissioner Michel P. Florio. Kenneth Schisler, VP of Regulatory and Government Affairs for EnerNOC, was also present at the time of the communication.

Ms. Tierney-Lloyd stated that it was EnerNOC's position that the Commission needed to reach a resolution on the 2017 Demand Response (DR) Program Plans and begin a process to evaluate 2018 options as soon as possible. Ms. Tierney-Lloyd indicated that, with May approaching, DR Providers, such as EnerNOC, have no visibility as to the options it will have for providing services to its customers in 2017 with the exception of its bid for DRAM services and the Investor Owned Utilities' (IOUs') 2017 DR Program proposals.

According to Ms. Tierney-Lloyd, if the IOUs' proposals were adopted by the Commission, EnerNOC would have to do some significant work to modify its customer relationships for 2017, including new contracting and moving customers from current programs into other programs. As an example, Ms. Tierney-Lloyd stated that Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) had proposed to eliminate the Aggregator Managed Portfolio (AMP) contracts. Further, Ms. Tierney-Lloyd noted that there is also no visibility into what options may be available for 2018, including for Demand Response Auction Mechanism (DRAM). For these reasons, Ms. Tierney-Lloyd urged the Commission to move as quickly as possible to provide some clarity to DR Providers for 2017 and 2018.
