ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING DIRECTING APPLICANT TO SUBMIT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

On August 16, 2016, Tel-One Network Services, Inc. (Applicant) filed Application 16-08-008 for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) to operate as a competitive local carrier in order to provide facilities-based high-speed fiber-optic-based broadband services to residential and business customers within the City and County of San Francisco.

In order to properly consider this application for a CPCN, the Commission must fully understand the services that Applicant proposes to offer and how those services relate to the Commission's jurisdiction over telecommunications services pursuant to state and federal law. Accordingly, Applicant shall respond to the following:

1. Please describe in detail the services to be provided by Applicant. Address in detail what technologies and protocols will be used to provide these services, including whether these services will be offered over broadband facilities and whether services will be offered using Time-Division Multiplexing, Internet Protocol or other protocols. Also address the extent to which the services will be provided over the Public Switched Telephone

- Network1, specifically whether voice telephone services will be provided.
2. Please provide the legal basis on which Applicant claims the Commission can grant it the requested CPCN and why the Applicant believes the requested authority is necessary. Among other things, Applicant's response should address Public Utilities Code Sections 216, 233-234, 239, 710, and 1001; and 47 USC Code Sections 153(43) and 251; and any other applicable statutes or case law.

IT IS RULED that Applicant shall file a full response to the above questions by October 21, 2016.
