Summary

On June 1, 2016, Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) Company filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting approval for the forecasted funding required in 2017 to obtain electricity on behalf of its customers. In addition, PG&E also requests approval of forecasted revenues from the sale of emissions allowances associated with California's Greenhouse Gas (GHG) reduction program. This application is referred to as the 2017 Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) and Generation Non-bypassable Charges Forecast and Greenhouse Gas Forecast Revenue and Reconciliation Application A.16-06-003.

About the filing

PG&E's application primarily includes requests for approval of:

1. The forecasted recovery of \$4.3 billion in electricity costs. These costs are associated with the fuel needed to produce electricity as well as the costs of buying electricity from third parties, such as renewable energy producers.
2. The forecasted spending of \$1.3 million in 2017 for administrative and outreach expenses associated with California's GHG reduction program. Additionally, the recovery of \$1.1 million for administrative and outreach costs spent to administer the return of GHG revenue to eligible customers in 2015.
3. The return of \$312 million to eligible customers from the sale of GHG emissions allowances and a semi-annual climate credit of \$27.86 per customer.

The use of all funds collected and the exact amounts may change and are subject to CPUC regulatory approval. PG&E will provide the CPUC with updated figures closer to when rates go into effect to ensure that the most current and accurate information available is used.

PG&E would not profit from any of the requests in this application. The cost of energy is passed directly to PG&E's customers without any markup. If the CPUC approves the application, PG&E will begin to recover its costs in electric rates, effective January 1, 2017. At the end of 2017, to ensure all funds are used on the customers' behalf, PG&E will compare the actual costs to produce and purchase energy against revenues collected from customers and will incorporate any differences in next year's application. PG&E will return GHG allowance revenue to residential, small business and some industrial customers through rates and the California Climate Credit, based on methods determined by the state legislature and the CPUC. The revenue is intended to reduce the impact of the cost of the GHG reduction program on customers' electric rates.

Evidentiary Hearings

At the evidentiary hearings noted above, PG&E and other formal parties to the proceeding will present their evidence through testimony and will be subject to cross-examination before an Administrative Law Judge (Judge). **The hearings are open to the public, but only those who are formal parties are permitted to present evidence and/or cross-examine witnesses.** After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal process, the Judge will issue a proposed decision which may accept PG&E's proposal, modify it or reject it. Any one of the five Commissioners may also issue an alternate decision based on the record. The proposed decision and any alternate will be acted upon at a CPUC Voting Meeting where the Commissioners will decide whether to adopt the proposed or an alternate decision.


I, ERICA KOZOCAS declare:

SUMMARY

On March 1, 2016, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submitted an application to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) requesting to increase its electric rates for its 2015 Nuclear Decommissioning Triennial Proceeding (NDCTP). In this application, PG&E requests approval to recover costs associated with funding the nuclear decommissioning trusts for the Diablo Canyon Power Plant and Humboldt Bay Power Plant. This application also addresses the amount PG&E's customers are responsible for paying to decommission the nuclear power plants. If approved, PG&E's request would raise electric rates effective January 1, 2017.

WHAT IS THE NDCTP?

The NDCTP provides the CPUC, and other interested parties, an opportunity to review PG&E's updated nuclear decommissioning cost studies for Humboldt Bay Power Plant Unit 3 (HBPP Unit 3) and Diablo Canyon Units 1 & 2 (Diablo Canyon). The nuclear decommissioning cost studies are detailed estimates of costs associated with decommissioning (tearing down) PG&E's nuclear power plants. The NDCTP also provides the opportunity for review of the associated customer contribution analysis, which determines the annual amount customers, as a whole, will contribute to the nuclear decommissioning trust funds. The contributions made by PG&E customers to the HBPP Unit 3 trust fund will support the ongoing decommissioning activities for the HBPP Unit 3. These contributions will also fund the operations and maintenance (O&M) activities associated with the storage of spent fuel at HBPP Unit 3. Customer contributions to the Diablo Canyon trust fund will pay for the eventual safe and responsible decommissioning of Diablo Canyon. The NDCTP also provides review of PG&E's O&M costs associated with maintaining the existing nuclear license at HBPP Unit 3. Additionally, the NDCTP provides the CPUC and interested parties the opportunity to review the costs associated with completed nuclear decommissioning activities at HBPP Unit 3 to ensure that those activities costs are accurate.

COST TO CUSTOMERS

This application will result in an overall increase for PG&E customers. For 2017, the forecasted electric revenue requirement increase will be \$77.308 million, from \$107.433 (2016 authorized) to \$184.741 million (2017 proposed). If approved, PG&E's request would raise electric rates effective January 1, 2017, for bundled customers who receive electric generation and distribution service from PG&E. A typical residential customer, using 500 kWh per month, would see a bill increase from \$97.14 to \$97.65.

At the evidentiary hearings noted above, PG&E and other formal parties to the proceeding will present their evidence through testimony and will be subject to cross-examination before an Administrative Law Judge (Judge). **The hearings are open to the public, but only those who are formal parties are permitted to present evidence and/or cross-examine witnesses.** After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal process, the Judge will issue a proposed decision which may accept PG&E's proposal, modify it or deny it. Any of the five Commissioners may issue an alternate decision based on the record. The proposed decision and any alternates will be acted upon at a CPUC Voting Meeting where the Commissioners will decide whether to adopt the proposed or an alternate decision.
