NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to Rule 8.3 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission), Everyday Energy hereby gives notice of an ex parte communication in Commission Rulemaking 14-07-002. On October 4, 2016 Co-Founder and CEO for Everyday Energy, Scott Sarem; Dawn Anaiscourt, Director, CPUC Regulatory Affairs Southern California Edison Company; G Andrew Blauvelt from the MASH Coalition; Kelly Knutsen, Policy Advisor, California Solar Energy Industries Association (CALSEIA); Chris Taylor, Co-Founder and COO for Everyday Energy; Scott Peattie from SolarCity on behalf of CALSEIA, and Tony Brunello from California Strategies, met with Scott Murtishaw, Energy Advisor in the Office of President, Michael Picker. The meeting was initiated by Mr. Sarem and took place at the Commission offices at 505 Van Ness Street in San Francisco California. The meeting began at 3:30 pm and lasted approximately 30 minutes.

The meeting was oral and no written materials were provided. The purpose of the meeting was to demonstrate that the meeting participants, who collectively have the most extensive experience in California in delivering solar PV to multifamily affordable housing and have been the main participants in the MASH Program over the past seven years – either as an administrator of the MASH Program (SCE), owner of deed-restricted affordable housing properties that have utilized the MASH Program to install both common area and tenant-benefitting solar (MASH Coalition), or the companies that have worked to finance and install solar for multifamily affordable housing (Everyday Energy and CALSEIA members) – expressed our collective agreement that the legislative intent of AB 693 is to utilize the current MASH Program infrastructure to implement AB 693.
