NOTICE OF SCHEDULED INDIVIDUAL *EX PARTE* MEETING**

Pursuant to Rule 8.3(c)(2) of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) Rules of Practice and Procedure, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby gives notice that it has been granted an individual ex parte communication meeting.¹

On Tuesday, January 31, 2017, Laura Genao, Director of Regulatory Affairs, and Jack Horne, Principal Advisor of Regulatory Affairs, are scheduled to meet with David Peck, Advisor to President Picker, at the Commission’s San Francisco office. The purpose of the meeting is to provide support for the recently issued Proposed Decision in the above-captioned proceeding. The meeting will take place at 1:00 p.m. and is expected to last approximately thirty minutes.

¹ Rule 8.3(c)(2) applies to individual ex parte meetings with Commission decisionmakers. Rule 8.1(b) defines decisionmakers to include Commissioners, the Chief Administrative Law Judge, the Assigned ALJ and the Law and Motion ALJ. However, new Section 1701.1(e)(2)(B) of the California Public Utilities Code, enacted as part of SB 215, requires the Commission to adopt and publish a definition of decisionmaker that also includes each Commissioner’s personal staff when acting in a policy or legal advisory capacity. Although the Commission has not yet adopted such a rule, in conformity with the Legislature’s intent in SB 215, SCE is treating Commissioner advisors as decisionmakers for purposes of the Commission ex parte rules. However, under new Section 1701.3(h)(3)(B), the equal time requirement does not apply if the meeting is with a Commissioner’s personal staff.
