**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING ALLOWING COMMENTS TO
PARTIES' PROPOSED CONFIDENTIAL MATRICES**

On August 18, 2017, the assigned Commissioner issued a ruling identifying potential subjects for confidential matrices that designate specific categories of information as confidential pursuant to Section 3.4 of General Order 66-D. The ruling also directed parties to establish industry working groups to meet and confer and file proposed matrices using the subjects identified in the Assigned Commissioner's Ruling as a basis.

Pursuant to the Assigned Commissioner's Ruling, parties subsequently formed various working groups and thereafter, filed proposed confidential matrices on October 3, 2017.

This ruling allows parties to file comments to any of the proposed confidential matrices submitted by the various working groups. Comments shall not exceed five pages in length (excluding any attachments) and shall be due no later than Monday, October 30, 2017.

IT IS RULED that:

1. Parties may file comments to any of the proposed confidential matrices submitted by the various working groups.
2. Comments shall not exceed five pages in length and shall be filed by Monday, October 30, 2017.

This ruling is effective today.
