ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE JUNGREIS:

Thank you very much. This may sound a little redundant at times, but I will be running through this from the start, because each of these PPHs -- each of these Public Participation Hearings will be considered their own standalone hearings, and consequently, statements made about -- or comments made before or prefaces made before will not be heard on this transcript. So bear with me, please.

Good evening. I am Administrative Law Judge Jason Jungreis with the California Public Utilities Commission, and I will be conducting tonight's Public Participation Hearing for Application A.19-03-008. Briefly described in this application, Bear Valley Electric Service seeks permission to own and operate a solar project.

Now, if you come up to make statements, if you happen to have an extra copy of your statements for the court reporters, that would be appreciated.

I'd like to begin by introducing others who are here. You have heard from ALJ

1 Bemederfer. You now have an opportunity to  
2 meet and hear from Marie Claire Brown, who is  
3 the advisor for Commissioner Genevieve  
4 Shiroma, who is the commissioner to whom  
5 these application proceedings, or at least  
6 the present one that I'm addressing, is  
7 assigned.

8 And on behalf of the California  
9 Public Utilities Commission and on behalf of  
10 Commissioner Shiroma and Ms. Brown, welcome  
11 to the hearing. We know it's a burden for  
12 you to come here on a weekday night, and it  
13 is very much appreciated that you would  
14 provide us with the benefit of your  
15 knowledge, your comments and your thoughts on  
16 this proceeding.

17 Ms. Brown, would you now like to  
18 share a few comments on behalf of  
19 Commissioner Shiroma?

20 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER BROWN

21 Thank you. Hello, everyone.  
22 Again, my name is Marie Claire Brown, and I'm  
23 an advisor to Commissioner Genevieve Shiroma,  
24 who's assigned to these latter two cases.  
25 She couldn't be here tonight, but she did  
26 send me in her place.

27 And these Public Participation  
28 Hearings are really an important part of

1 building the record for the proceedings, and  
2 so she really appreciates you all being here  
3 today. And I will report back to her on what  
4 I hear. Thank you.

5 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you. Also present  
6 are representatives of the electric utility.  
7 Now, I will not have them speak here. They  
8 are parties to the proceeding, and they have  
9 an ample opportunity to speak during the  
10 proceedings. However, I would like them to  
11 raise their hands, indicate who they are, so  
12 that if anyone has any question for them or  
13 any comments or anything that they would like  
14 to state to them or ask them off the record,  
15 they may do so.

16 So would everyone from either Golden  
17 State or Bear Valley please raise their hand?  
18 Okay. Great. Thank you very much for that.

19 Also present is a representative of  
20 the Commission's Public Advocates Office,  
21 which has filed a protest in this matter. I  
22 wonder if that representative could please  
23 raise her hand? Thank you very much.

24 So again, if you have any questions  
25 or comments not to be made during this  
26 hearing, but directly to one of the parties  
27 of the action, you are free to do so.

28 Lastly, also present are

1 representatives of the Commission's Public  
2 Advisor's Office, which has organized this  
3 Public Participation Hearing. And you have  
4 met them. They are seated by the door. I  
5 will be referring to them a moment later in  
6 my comments.

7 Now, I wish to make clear that this  
8 is an opportunity for us to hear from you,  
9 and therefore, if you would please do so on  
10 the record, and enable us to benefit from the  
11 wisdom, comments and experiences that you  
12 have had.

13 Now, I'm going to go into this  
14 proceeding a little bit more deeply to ensure  
15 we all understand what the hearing is about.  
16 Application A.19-03-008 was filed on  
17 March 11th, 2019 by Golden State Water  
18 Company on behalf of its Bear Valley Electric  
19 Service division, which is the electric  
20 utility in this area. The application  
21 requests authorization for approval of its  
22 acquisition and operation of the Bear Valley  
23 Solar Energy Project, which I'll refer to as  
24 the project, along with authorization for  
25 ratemaking associated with the project and  
26 authorization to deviate from its tariff in  
27 certain regards to the project. The  
28 application also requests that the proceeding

1 be expedited pursuant to the expiration of a  
2 tax credit allowance that is related to this  
3 project. ]

4 The core of the project concerns the  
5 construction of a 7.9 megawatt solar plant  
6 which would become utility-owned generation.  
7 The project is proposed to be a benefit in  
8 regard to the utility's renewables portfolio  
9 standard requirements, reduce local  
10 greenhouse gas emissions, and provide  
11 increased grid reliability and price  
12 stability.

13 On April 15, 2019, the Commission's  
14 Public Advocates Office filed a protest  
15 against the application requesting that the  
16 Commission consider whether the project is  
17 reasonable and provides ratepayers with  
18 adequate protections. To consider whether to  
19 approve this project, the Commission has  
20 essentially determined the following  
21 questions need to be answered:

22 One, is the project consistent with  
23 the utility's clean energy and reliability  
24 obligations?

25 Two, is the project a reasonable and  
26 cost effective way for the utility to meet  
27 its clean energy obligations?

28 Three, does the underlying purchase

1 and sales agreement provide adequate  
2 ratepayer protections, and are its costs and  
3 pricing reasonable?

4 Four, should the Big Bear Area  
5 Regional Wastewater Agency on whose land the  
6 project would be sited, should it receive a  
7 special tariff deviation?

8 Five, is the project compliant with  
9 the California Environmental Quality Act, or  
10 CEQA as its often referred, and, six, does  
11 the project raise any safety concerns?

12 Thank you to those who have signed  
13 up. I look forward to calling you so that  
14 you can speak. Please limit your comments to  
15 approximately two minutes.

16 My last comment is that anyone who  
17 wishes to obtain more information can find  
18 out about this proceeding by going online to  
19 the Commission's website and looking up this  
20 proceeding number. You can also contact the  
21 Commission's Public Advisors Office online to  
22 learn more about how you can further provide  
23 comments. You can do that by calling

26 Thank you very much. I look forward  
27 to your comments. At this time the two  
28 speakers I have identified on the speaker



1 list would be, first, David Lawrence of the  
2 Big Bear Area Regional Wastewater Agency.

3 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER LAWRENCE

4 Thank you very much, your Honor.  
5 Thank you for having me here today. I just  
6 wanted to voice my support for this project.  
7 Obviously it is a financial benefit to our  
8 ratepayers overall to have clean energy up in  
9 the valley. It also provides a sustainable  
10 extra resource for power in the valley. We  
11 currently self-generate power through  
12 generators and it would help us stop doing  
13 that activity and provide for a cleaner  
14 energy for our facility over all.

15 So we are here in support of the  
16 project over all. We've done due diligence  
17 and looked at the project and we are really  
18 excited about the project in the future.  
19 Thank you very much.

20 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you very much for  
21 your comments. I appreciate them.

22 Next up we have Barbara Nitkin.

23 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER NITKIN

24 Thank you, your Honor. I am  
25 totally supportive of that project. I think  
26 it's long overdue and it's a step in the  
27 right way for sustainability for the Bear  
28 Valley. As a former CFO of a wastewater

1 treatment facility, I really appreciate the  
2 costs that are incurred and, having analyzed  
3 the costs to the CSD diligently and presented  
4 to the County of San Bernardino to hold our  
5 rates down -- successfully I might add -- I  
6 100 percent appreciate that this should go  
7 forward. But it would probably be prudent to  
8 put it under the existing corporate  
9 structure. Thank you.

10 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you very much for  
11 your comments.

12 Additionally we have Steven Hoppe  
13 who is now wishing to step forward to make  
14 comments.

15 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER HOPPE

16 Thank you. I've got a few  
17 questions. Effective January 1, 2018, Bear  
18 Valley Electric Public Service Commission was  
19 allowed to stop offering solar to their  
20 customers. There are multiple customers up  
21 here. There are other ways of solving this  
22 particular problem as far as solar. I,  
23 alone, know enough customers total up to  
24 three and four megawatts.

25 People up here are paying extremely  
26 high rates. People need relief on those  
27 rates. Businesses need to keep their doors  
28 open. I can't divulge people's books and

1 their accounting situations, but I can assure  
2 you I've seen enough businesses up here that  
3 are just scraping by. We want to know how is  
4 this going to be paid for?

5 The rumor on the mountain is for  
6 the next 20 years the customers are going to  
7 pay for this and after 20 years we might get  
8 a benefit. Where are the facts in how this  
9 is going to be paid for? Why is the utility  
10 company allowing to give an on-grid system to  
11 the water district? And I'm talking about  
12 the one that they snuck through without any  
13 type of meeting at all behind the community  
14 center, as well as this particular  
15 implementation when the rest of the customers  
16 up here are not allowed to have solar  
17 systems? How are they going to handle the  
18 2020 Rule in regards to new construction?

19 These are questions that need to be  
20 answered and they seriously need to be looked  
21 at before we just willy-nilly move forward  
22 and allow them to build a solar farm and then  
23 turn back around and increase their operating  
24 costs and charge us to pay for it and then  
25 charge us for the electricity it generates.

26 Do you realize that we've got some  
27 of the highest rates in the continental US?  
28 People cannot afford it. I've over the years

1 helped people who are barely scraping by in  
2 keeping their homes and be able to reduce  
3 their operating costs. I've helped  
4 businesses.

5 The last implementation up here was  
6 the bowling alley. I'm not going to go into  
7 their financial situation, but they needed  
8 that utility cost reduction to keep the doors  
9 open. Enough's enough with unknown rate  
10 increases and changes. Where in the  
11 documentation does it tell us what this is  
12 going to cost us? Thank you.

13 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you for your  
14 questions and participation.

15 Are there any other comments?  
16 Anyone else who wants to step forward and be  
17 heard on this public participation hearing?

18 Sir.

19 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER SAVILLE

20 Yes, my name is Ken Saville and I'm  
21 a ratepayer. I'm building a house and I'm  
22 not allowed to hook up solar. I've lived off  
23 the grid for many years and I'm a little  
24 confused as to the NEMs 2.0, the net  
25 metering, they are not a party to so then I  
26 do not have the ability to generate solar and  
27 feed it back into the grid. But I kind of  
28 always thought that the State was supposed to

1 encourage that. But our electric company  
2 does not.

3 I am prohibited in connecting solar  
4 panels to the grid and yet they want to. I'm  
5 not able to take advantage of the solar tax  
6 credits, but they want to. So I'm a little  
7 irritated with that. Anyway, thank you.

8 ALJ JUNGREIS: Mr. Saville, if you  
9 would before you leave the podium, could you  
10 spell your name for the record, please.

11 SPEAKER SAVILLE: S-a-v-i-l-l-e.

12 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you.

13 And if I may, I would comment that  
14 for Mr. Hoppe and Mr. Saville, the comments  
15 you have made might be pertinent for the next  
16 public participation hearing which we'll  
17 start I think in just a moment with regard to  
18 distributed generation. So perhaps you might  
19 want to make your comments pursuant to that  
20 application as well.

21 SPEAKER SAVILLE: I'm also signed up to  
22 that.

23 ALJ JUNGREIS: Very good.

24 Is there anyone else who would like  
25 to speak as to this proceeding?

26 Madam, if you would come forward,  
27 please. Thank you.

28 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER KESSLER

1           Sorry it takes me a little bit of  
2 time. I am a very senior citizen and I've  
3 been upset with the electric company --

4           ALJ JUNGREIS: I'm so sorry for the  
5 interruption. Could you please state your  
6 name --

7           SPEAKER KESSLER: Okay, my name is  
8 Linda Kessler and I've had a house up here  
9 for over 30 years, part-time and full-time.  
10 We've been very supportive of solar energy in  
11 my family for a long time and I was  
12 interested in putting solar energy into my  
13 home up here only to learn that the electric  
14 company, BVES, has a monopoly and don't want  
15 us to enter the grid. How ridiculous is  
16 this?

17           And yet they want to put in a big  
18 farm of solar energy over here at the water  
19 whatever thing and I don't understand it.  
20 We're paying high rates as senior citizens.  
21 Many of us are retired. We do not have more  
22 income than what we're getting right now. It  
23 doesn't go up. It stays the same.

24           Many of us don't have the ability to  
25 pay our own bills just because we do not have  
26 an income that supports that and BVS has  
27 very, very high rates. I know that from  
28 other places where I've lived and seeing the

1 difference. So while I support it, I don't  
2 understand why the BVS should have a monopoly  
3 on solar energy. I really feel that this is  
4 the time to speak out. Thank you.

5 ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you very much,  
6 Ms. Kessler. While you're standing there,  
7 could you please spell your name.

8 SPEAKER KESSLER: Yes, K-e-s-s-l-e-r.

9 ALJ JUNGREIS: Very good. Thank you  
10 very much.

11 Is there anyone else who would wish  
12 to be heard on this? And, of course,  
13 remember we have another public participation  
14 hearing on distributed generation to take  
15 place when this one is completed.

16 Sir, if you'd come forward, please.

17 STATEMENT OF SPEAKER CARETTO

18 Good evening. Again, my name is  
19 David Caretto, spelled C-a-r-e-t-t-o. Again,  
20 I'm a member of the city council. As a  
21 second hat, I'm also the chairman of the Big  
22 Bear Area Regional Wastewater Agency, which  
23 serves the City of Big Bear Lake, the  
24 unincorporated East Valley, and the county  
25 service area in Fawnskin.

26 On behalf of the board of directors  
27 of BARWA, we generally support this project  
28 because not only will we have a lease

1 agreement with Bear Valley Electric for the  
2 use of our property, but if the rate  
3 variation is approved as we've requested, we  
4 should be able to either reduce or hold back  
5 rate increases for our customers who also are  
6 all of the customers in the Big Bear Valley.

7           So we generally support the project  
8 and hope that you will consider appropriate  
9 measures to condition it so that it meets the  
10 needs of our citizens. Thank you.

11           ALJ JUNGREIS: Thank you very much,  
12 sir.

13           Is there anyone else who wishes to  
14 be heard with regard to this application,  
15 which is, again, A.19-03-008, the solar  
16 project?

17           UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Quick question  
18 before you start the third one. I don't  
19 believe any of us received documentation on  
20 the third one to know what it is.

21           ALJ JUNGREIS: Okay. We will have  
22 concluded now A.19-03-008. We'll go off the  
23 record for a moment.

24           (Whereupon, at the hour of 6:52 p.m.  
25 the Commission then adjourned.)


