ORDER EXTENDING STATUTORY DEADLINE**Summary**

This decision extends the statutory deadline in this proceeding to October 15, 2014.

Background

Public Utilities Code Section 1701.5 provides that ratesetting matters such as this application shall be resolved within 18 months of issuance of the scoping memo for the proceeding, unless the Commission makes findings why that statutory deadline cannot be met and issues an order extending the 18-month deadline for a period not exceeding 60 days.

In this proceeding, the scoping memo was issued on February 14, 2013, therefore the 18-month deadline for resolving the proceeding is August 16, 2014.

On December 3, 2012, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) filed this application regarding its 2013 Rate Design Window in compliance with Decision (D.) 11-12-053 to file a demand charge cost study and an evaluation of "Option R" for customers on PG&E's rate Schedule E-19 and E-20, that is, those customers with solar unit production that exceed 10% of the customers' demand.

On January 14, 2013, Solar Energy Industries Association filed a protest to the application requesting the Commission not to accept the study PG&E has presented. A prehearing conference was held and concluded on February 5, 2013. After the scoping memo was issued, PG&E filed a motion to revise the scheduled and the motion was denied. An Evidentiary hearing was held on July 9, 2013 and parties filed their briefs and reply briefs. Further review is needed to prepare a final decision for Commission consideration. Therefore, a 60-day extension of the statutory deadline until October 15, 2014, is necessary to allow the Commission time to deliberate on the final decision.

Waiver of Comment Period

Under Rule 14.6(c)(4) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, the Commission may reduce or waive the period for public review and comment of decisions extending the deadline for resolving ratesetting proceedings. We waive the period for public review and comment pursuant to this rule.

Assignment of Proceeding

Michael R. Peevey is the assigned Commissioner and Douglas Long is the assigned Judge in this proceeding.

Findings of Fact

1. This proceeding was initiated on December 3, 2012.
2. The 18-month deadline for resolving the proceeding is August 16, 2014.
3. An extension of time until October 15, 2014 is necessary to allow further review and to allow the Commission time to deliberate on the final decision.

Conclusions of Law

1. Pursuant to the authority granted the Commission under Public Utilities Code Section 1701.5(a), the statutory deadline for this proceeding should be extended to October 15, 2014.

2. Pursuant to Rule 14.6(c)(4), the comment period for the proposed decision should be waived.

IT IS ORDERED that the extension of the statutory deadline for this proceeding is extended to October 15, 2014.
