**DECISION CORRECTING TABLE 2 IN DECISION 15-01-035 FOR THE CALIFORNIA SOLAR INITIATIVE THERMAL PROGRAM****Summary**

This decision solely corrects a mathematical error in Table 2 of Decision 15-01-035. No changes are made to the California Solar Initiative Thermal Program. This proceeding remains open.

**1. Background**

Decision (D.) 15-01-035 granted the Petition for Modification of D.12-08-008 and D.13-08-004 by the Program Administrators of the California Solar Initiative (CSI) Thermal Program and the California Solar Energy Industries Association. The modifications to the CSI Thermal Program approved by the Commission included:

- Higher incentive levels for the single-family and multifamily/commercial sub-programs;
- A separate budget for the solar pool heating system sub-program;

- Reallocation of the sub-program budgets as 10% single-family, 60% multifamily/commercial, and 30% solar pool heating;
- A higher individual project cap for multifamily/commercial of \$800,000;
- An individual project rebate cap for solar pool heating systems at 50% of total system cost; and
- Authorization for the PAs to request substantial future changes to the Program via Tier 2 advice letter filings.

D.15-01-035 set forth the CSI Thermal budget allocations in a table, *Table 2:*

*New sub-program budget allocations by step and by PA (\$).* Table 2 served to illustrate the budgetary changes to the CSI Thermal program based on D.15-01-035. Table 2 is found on page 20 of D.15-01-035 and pages 2 and 3 of Appendix A. Table 2 also illustrates the reallocation of sub-program budgets and the creation of a separate budget for the solar pool heating sub-program.

## **2. Correction to Table 2 in D.15-01-035**

Table 2 in D.15-01-035 included mathematical errors. Today's decision corrects these errors. These mathematical errors do not affect program implementation but are corrected for accounting purposes. A revised Table 2 with the corrected information is shown in strikethrough/bold below. This decision approves these revisions to Table 2.

**Conclusion of Law**

1. Table 2 in D.15-01-035, as revised by today's decision, is correct.

**O R D E R**

**IT IS ORDERED** that:

1. Table 2 in Decision 15-01-035 shall be replaced with the corrected Table 2 in today's decision.
2. Rulemaking 12-11-005 remains open.
