RESOLUTION

Resolution E-5026. Temporary Update to Appendix S of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan.

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- This Resolution would approve a temporary update to Pacific Gas and Electric Company's 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan, without modification.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

- There is no anticipated impact on safety.

ESTIMATED COST:

- The Commission does not anticipate that this Resolution would result in additional costs for Pacific Gas and Electric Company's ratepayers.

SUMMARY

This Resolution would approve, without modification, a temporary update to Appendix S of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan. The update would expire after the timeframe identified by PG&E in Confidential Attachment A to Advice Letter (AL) 5589-E, at which time the version of Appendix S approved by Resolution E-4998 (with conforming modifications approved via AL 5579-E) would once more apply.

BACKGROUND

Resolution E-4998 (approved May 30, 2019) made several changes to PG&E's 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan, including the addition of Appendix S, which describes PG&E's process for sales of Resource Adequacy (RA) products and of certain energy products. Resolution E-4998 also required several modifications to Appendix S, which PG&E subsequently implemented via AL 5579-E (effective July 1, 2019). In AL 5589-E, PG&E requests modification of a specific confidential portion of Appendix S and identifies a limited timeframe during which this modification would apply. We address this modification in more detail in Confidential Appendix A to this Resolution.

NOTICE

Notice of AL 5589-E was made by publication in the Commission's Daily Calendar. PG&E states that a copy of the Advice Letter was mailed and distributed in accordance with Section 4 of General Order 96-B.

PROTESTS

Advice Letter 5589-E was not protested.

DISCUSSION

The Commission has reviewed AL 5589-E and finds that PG&E's request for a temporary modification to Appendix S of its 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan is reasonable. We confirm that this modification will only apply for a specific timeframe, after which the version of Appendix S approved by Resolution E-4998 (with conforming modifications approved via AL 5579-E) will once more apply. As the modified portion of Appendix S is confidential, we discuss the modification in more detail in Confidential Appendix A to this Resolution.

COMMENTS

Public Utilities Code section 311(g)(1) provides that this resolution must be served on all parties and subject to at least 30 days public review. Please note that comments are due 20 days from the mailing date of this resolution. Section

311(g)(2) provides that this 30-day review period and 20-day comment period may be reduced or waived upon the stipulation of all parties in the proceeding.

The 30-day review and 20-day comment period for the draft of this resolution was neither waived nor reduced. Accordingly, this draft resolution was mailed to parties for comments, and will be placed on the Commission's agenda no earlier than 30 days from today.

FINDINGS

1. Pacific Gas and Electric Company's request for a temporary modification to Appendix S of its 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan is reasonable.
2. The proposed modification will only apply for a specific timeframe, after which the version of Appendix S approved by Resolution E-4998 (with conforming modifications approved via AL 5579-E) will once more apply.

THEREFORE IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The request of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company to temporarily amend Appendix S of its 2014 Conformed Bundled Procurement Plan, as requested in Advice Letter 5589-E, is approved.

This Resolution is effective today.
