**SCOPE OF WORKSHOP:**

As a result of the December 16, 2009 En Banc on Utility Disconnections, the California Public Utilities Commission will convene a public workshop to determine ways to improve customer notification and education resulting in a lower number of households experiencing a disruption in electric and/or natural gas service.

The four investor-owned utilities (IOUs), Pacific Gas & Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, Southern California Gas Company and San Diego Gas & Electric Company, will discuss current practices for customer notification and education building upon the discussions at the December 16 En Banc. Parties are invited to attend to discuss and offer ideas to improve notification and education practices.

At the December 17 Commission Meeting, President Michael R. Peevey announced that the four IOUs had voluntarily instituted a moratorium on all residential and small business service disconnections through January 3<sup>rd</sup>. We have since learned that Southern California Edison has extended its moratorium to January 21. In holding this workshop, it is the goal of the Commission to ensure that when the moratorium ends, customers having financial difficulty paying their monthly utility bill will have either already contacted their electric or natural gas company to set up a payment plan and enroll in assistance programs or at the very least understand that they should contact their service provider for this assistance. On October 11, 2009, the Governor signed SB 412 (Stats. 2009, ch. 182) into law. SB 412 authorizes the CPUC, in consultation with the California Air Resources Board (ARB), to determine eligible technologies for the Self Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) based on the requirement that they "achieve reductions of greenhouse gas emissions pursuant to the California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006."

On November 13, 2009, an ALJ Ruling was issued in R.08-03-008, soliciting comments from parties on implementing the provisions of SB 412. This workshop will consider the questions posed in that ruling. An agenda will be posted on the CPUC Daily Calendar closer to the date of the workshop.
