**AMENDMENT TO APPLICATION OF

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Pursuant to Rule 1.12 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, ConocoPhillips Pipe Line Company ("CPPL") respectfully submits this "Amendment to Application of ConocoPhillips Pipe Line Company." On February 17, 2012, CPPL submitted its "Application for an Exemption Pursuant to Section 853 of the Public Utilities Code or, Alternatively, for an Order Under Section 854 Authorizing the Transfer of Direct and Indirect Control of a Public Utility" ("Application") in the referenced docket. At that time, CPPL also filed the "Motion of ConocoPhillips Pipe Line Company for Authority to File and Maintain Confidential Information Under Seal" ("February 17 Motion"). The February 17 Motion requested that the Commission afford confidential treatment to the non-public draft Separation and Distribution Agreement submitted as Application Exhibit D. In its Application, CPPL indicated that it would inform the Commission should the draft Separation and Distribution Agreement become a public document and no longer require confidential treatment.

On March 1, 2012, the draft Separation and Distribution Agreement was filed publicly with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Accordingly, CPPL hereby amends its Application to make the draft Separation and Distribution Agreement submitted as Application Exhibit D and attached hereto as Attachment 1 part of the official, public available record in the

referenced docket.<sup>1</sup> Through a separate filing submitted concurrently with this Amendment, CPPL is moving to withdraw the February 17 Motion.

Due to the now public nature of the draft Separation and Distribution Agreement, all references in the Application to the confidential nature of the draft Separation and Distribution Agreement should be stricken. All other aspects of the Application, including but not limited to its terms, declarations and exhibits, shall remain in full force and effect as originally submitted to the Commission.
