AVOIDED COST CAPACITY PRICES FOR QUALIFYING FACILITIES

Pursuant to California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC") Decision No. 07-09-040, the as-available capacity price for 2011 is \$41.22 / kW-year. Per D.82-01-103, capacity payments are reduced 50% for projects under Standard Offer No. 3 with no time of delivery meters.
