**Faith Bautista
President and CEO
National Asian American Coalition**

Faith Bautista is the President and CEO of National Asian American Coalition, a HUD-approved homeowner, small business and consumer advocacy organization serving our nation's 18 million Asian Americans. Through Faith's dedication and hard work, the NAAC has expanded to a national organization with its headquarters in the San Francisco Bay Area, a regulatory office in Washington, DC and a housing office in San Diego.

Faith advocates in the halls of Congress, in the California legislature and in front of key federal legislators, such as the Federal Reserve, FDIC, OCC, FHFA, FTC, FCC and SEC and among America's Fortune 500 corporations, as a major voice for the Asian American community. She is a member of the Office of Thrift Supervision Minority Depository Institutions Advisory Committee and sits on the Low-Income Oversight Board for the California Public Utilities Commission. Faith is the host of a prime time news show on The Filipino Channel, "Asian News in America" that discusses issues, such as the future of homeownership, small business lending, technical assistance and consumer protection.

Through her leadership, she has gained the support of Corporate America in reaching out to minority groups and has been a leading advocate for low-income and underserved communities.

Chairman and Founder

Len Canty is founder and chairman of the Black Economic Council (BEC), a national non-profit organization headquartered in Northern California established to promote economic empowerment for Black Americans and all communities of color.

The BEC focuses on shaping public policy to ensure Blacks are given opportunity and break the cycle of historic systematic disenfranchisement.

Driving issues related economic empowerment is a critical component of the advocacy work of the organization. Economic empowerment in promoting opportunities for Black owned businesses and job creation in local communities is the primary objective of the organization.

The BEC is geared towards providing a solid platform to bring together resources necessary to build wealth-producing assets within the Black community.

Len Canty has had successful careers in real estate financing and venture capital funding. Mr. Canty is founder and former President and Chief Executive Officer of NuCapital Access Group, Ltd., a private equity venture capital fund founded in 1993 with an economically targeted investment focus.

NuCapital provides venture funding, growth capital and acquisition financing to promising growth companies owned and operated by minorities and women. In 1984, he founded Canty & Associates, a mortgage brokerage firm that financed over \$400 million in real estate transactions.

Very active in his Oakland, California community, Len is one of the founding members and former President of the 100 Black Men of the Bay Area, Inc. He was Chairman of the 1993 African American Economic Empowerment Conference and was a recent lecturer in the African American Entrepreneurship program at California State University Hayward.

Jorge Corralejo
Chairman and President
Latino Business Chamber of Greater Los Angeles

Jorge C. Corralejo has been the President and CEO of Macondo Leasing Company for twenty-seven years, a corporation he founded in 1984. Jorge has also provided business consulting services to major national and international corporations. A graduate from UC Santa Barbara in 1971 he also received his Masters Degree from Brandeis University in 1975. Mr. Corralejo has taught Business Development in the California State University system and has worked as an advocate of small business and rural America in Washington D.C.

Throughout his career, Jorge has been an active leader in policy and issues that impact small and medium sized businesses, and on economic development. He has been a board member of various business chambers for the past twenty-seven years and most recently, is the founding Chairman of the Board of the Latino Business Chamber of Greater Los Angeles.

Appointed as an advisor to the California Organized Investment Network (California Dept. of Insurance) by three different Commissioners, he served with representatives of several national insurance companies. He has been a 15 year member of the Board of Directors of the Greenlining Institute, a state and national minority advocacy group. In the 1990's Jorge served as an organizer for the White House Conference on Small Business, and, on a task force to Rebuild Los Angeles during the city's difficult times.

Jorge is a founding member of the Merrill Lynch California Partnership for Economic Development (1998), and is on the Organizing Committee and Advisory Board for a new Latino owned Bank “Promerica”, in Los Angeles. He was appointed to the National Advisory Board of First American Title Company in 2005, and currently serves as a Commissioner on the Los Angeles County Small Business Commission and, is on the Board of Governors of the Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation.

Jorge has served on many other business and community Boards, and, has received several awards for his business advocacy and economic development activities. He has worked closely with several state and federal legislators on numerous pieces of legislation, and publishes occasional editorials in local newspapers and national journals.

Jorge is a founding member and Chairman of the Board of the Latino Business Chamber of Greater Los Angeles, a chamber with a different formula for success. Its growth has been based upon value added technical assistance to members, including the provision of a High Tech Center. Advocacy on policy issues impacting small business has brought some national attention to this chamber of commerce.
