NOTICE OF EX PARTE COMMUNICATION

Pursuant to Rule 8.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, EnerNOC, Inc., EnergyConnect, Inc. (now part of Johnson Controls, Inc.) (EnergyConnect/JCI), and Comverge, Inc. ("Demand Response (DR) Aggregators") hereby give notice of the following ex parte communication.

The communication occurred at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 7, 2012. The communication was oral and took place by telephone conference call to the Commission's offices at 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, California 94102.

The conference call communication was initiated by Sidney Dietz, Director, Regulatory Relations, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), with Matthew Tisdale, energy advisor to Commissioner Michel P. Florio, and Damon Franz, Advisor to Commission President Michael Peevey. Also present on the conference call were the following PG&E personnel: Kenneth Abreu, Principal Regulatory Analyst, Customer

Care; Boaz Ur, Manager, Customer Care; Nick Ho, Senior Manager, Customer Care; Kathy Rios, Senior Program Manager, Customer Care; and Mary Gandesbery, Attorney, Law Department. Also present on the conference call on behalf of the Demand Response (DR) Aggregators were: Carlos Lamas-Babbini, Program Director, Comverge; Rich Quattrini, Vice President of Marketing and Business Development, and David Weidberg, Regional Product Manager, for EnergyConnect/JCI; Melanie Gillette, Director Regulatory Affairs, Andrew Hoffman, Program Operations Manager, and Jose Villalobos, Energy Market Analyst, for EnerNOC; and Sara Steck Myers, attorney for DR Aggregators.

Mr. Quattrini, Mr. Lamas-Babbini, and Ms. Gillette joined in urging an immediate decision approving the 2012 extension of PG&E's Aggregator Managed Portfolio (AMP) contracts to be issued as final no later than April 19, 2012. Each stated that they were actively working with their customers and PG&E to enroll and enable customers in anticipation of an April 19 final decision, which would permit a May 1 season start for AMP. However, each advised that, absent an April 19 decision approving the AMP contracts without modification, the aggregators would have no choice but to immediately begin communicating to customers that there would be no AMP program for May. Ms. Gillette stated that such a result would negatively impact the ability of aggregators to meet customer commitments for a June season start.
