D/B/A AT&T CALIFORNIA (U-1001-C)
TO WITHDRAW JULY 15, 2011 MOTION FILED
PURSUANT TO ORDERING PARAGRAPH EIGHT**

On July 15, 2011 Pacific Bell Telephone Company d/b/a AT&T California (U-1001-C) (hereinafter "AT&T California"), pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 8 of the **Order Instituting Investigation on the Commission's Own Motion Into the Operations, Practices, and Conduct of OSP Communications LLC, and John Vogel, an Individual, to Determine Whether OSP Communications LLC and John Vogel Have Violated the Laws, Rules and Regulations of this State in the Provision of Operator and Calling Card Services to California Consumers; and Whether The Billing Resource LLC, a Delaware Corporation, and The Billing Resource LLC d/b/a/ Integretel, a California Corporation, Should Refund and Disgorge All Monies Billed and Collected on Behalf of OSP Communications LLC,**

filed May 26, 2011 (hereinafter, "OII"), submitted a motion requesting protection of the last seven pages of Attachment 28C of the Staff Report ("July 15 Motion").

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph 8 of the OII, Staff had served on AT&T California proposed public and proposed confidential versions of its Staff Report. Staff proposes to make Attachment 28C of the Staff Report public. The last seven pages (labeled Attachment A) of Attachment 28C appear to contain switch records, which consist of detailed information regarding calls made by customers, including telephone numbers and address information. However, Staff has agreed to redact the last four digits of each telephone number contained in the last seven pages of Attachment 28C, which redaction would eliminate AT&T's concerns regarding the confidential and proprietary nature of the information. Accordingly, provided this redaction is made, AT&T California withdraws its July 15 Motion. AT&T California expresses no view on whether other entities currently claim, would claim, or will claim that this information would remain confidential or proprietary after the redaction proposed by Staff.
