**MOTION FOR AUTHORIZATION TO FILE AND SERVE
REPLY COMMENTS ONE DAY LATE**

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August 16, 2011

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Pursuant to Rule 11.1 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC), ClearEdge Power moves for authorization to file and serve reply comments one day late.

1. ClearEdge Power

ClearEdge Power manufactures and markets the highly efficient ClearEdge5, a compact power and heat energy system for use in residential and small commercial buildings, including schools, small hotels, multi-family and affordable housing. The company has over 100 systems installed in California. ClearEdge Power is presently participating in this proceeding individually and as a member of the Fuel Cell and Hydrogen Energy Association.

2. Basis for Request

ClearEdge Power recently was granted party status in this proceeding, and on August 8, 2011 filed opening Comments on Proposed Decision Modifying the Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) and Implementing Senate Bill (SB) 412 (PD). Under the PD, ClearEdge Power's fuel cell technology is eligible for SGIP incentives.

ClearEdge Power attempted to timely file and serve Reply Comments on the PD on August 15, 2011. As a new participant to CPUC proceedings, ClearEdge Power encountered unanticipated and unavoidable difficulties during the electronic filing process that it was not able to resolve before the close of business on August 15. Accordingly, ClearEdge Power seeks authorization to file and serve Reply Comments on the PD one day late.

Authorizing ClearEdge Power to file and serve Reply Comments one day late will not prolong or delay this proceeding, nor will it adversely impact the interests of existing parties. Conversely, the interests of ClearEdge Power and its customers will be adversely impacted if this motion is not granted.

4. Conclusion

Based on the foregoing, ClearEdge Power respectfully requests that the Commission grant this motion for authorization to file and serve Reply Comments on the PD one day late.
