Pursuant to the verbal ALJ ruling at the prehearing conference of June 19, 2012, which was confirmed in an email dated June 21, 2012, the Siskiyou County Water Users Association (SCWUA) hereby submit this motion to accept Late-Filed Comments on the Petition for Modification filed by Pacific Power, which were served on June 20, 2012 and are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Under Rule 11.4 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, a party may file a motion to request that the Commission or Administrative Law Judge take a specific action. By this motion, SCWUA requests that the Administrative Law Judge permit SCWUA filed its comment to the Petition for Modification that was filed by PacifiCorp on January 13, 2012. As stated by SCWUA's counsel at the prehearing conference, SCWUA, while an interested party, has recently hired counsel to represent it in this phase of the proceeding. As such, SCWUA felt it important to have on the record its concerns about the Petition and the Klamath Hydroelectric Settlement Agreement, and this submitted late-filed comments. The late-filed comments will not likely adversely affect other parties as the Commission has already responded to the Petition as indicated in the Administrative Law Judge ruling of May 18, 2012.
