**SECOND QUARTERLY PROJECT STATUS REPORT  
OF SAN DIEGO GAS & ELECTRIC COMPANY

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Pursuant to D.08-12-058<sup>1</sup>, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (“SDG&E”) hereby serves the following quarterly project status report on the progress of the Sunrise Powerlink Transmission Project (“Sunrise”) in accordance with ordering paragraph #13.<sup>2</sup>

**I. THE DECISION DIRECTS SDG&E TO PROVIDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION**

Ordering paragraph #13, as well as in discussions in the body of the Decision,<sup>3</sup> directs SDG&E to provide project status updates, answering eight questions regarding the progress of the project.

<sup>2</sup> While the ordering paragraph does not specifically identify a date for the quarterly reports, as described on p. 1 of its first quarterly project status report submitted herein, SDG&E is planning to serve the quarterly reports on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month following each natural end of the calendar quarter, *i.e.*, April 15, July 15, October 15 and January 15. This allows the reports to capture the quarter-ending financial data that is not available on the final day of the quarter, but is available in the early part of each following month. SDG&E believes that this schedule will provide the Commission with the most current and accurate information available.

**1. Comprehensive project development schedule, including estimated project in-service date;**

SDG&E's Q2 2009 project development schedule is attached to this report as Appendix A. The estimated project in-service date remains approximately June 2012.

**2. Any changes in project scope and schedule, including the reasons for such changes;**

There are no changes to the project scope or schedule at this time. Due to the peninsular big horn sheep habitat, there is a construction blackout period between January and September of each year in the Mountain Springs Grade area. SDG&E will attempt to obtain a notice to proceed in this area by October 2009 to install foundations for 21 structures. If SDG&E is able to install these foundations, it will improve SDG&E's ability to meet the in-service date of June 2012.

**3. Specifically address the need for the Encina transformer, the cost of undergrounding in Alpine Boulevard, and the amount of undergrounding contemplated;**

The need for the Encina 230/138 kV transformer is under the evaluation and determination of the CAISO. The CAISO confirmed the need for the transformer in a letter to ALJ Vieth and the Sunrise service list on April 28, 2009.

The status of the undergrounding in Alpine Boulevard has not changed; the portion of the route from Peutz Valley to the entrance to the Star Valley Option current design is 5.85 miles in length. There are still two alternatives under consideration for the eastern terminus of the underground line, the east Alpine Boulevard alternative (an additional 2.05 miles of underground) and the Revised Star Valley Option (an additional .35 miles of underground).

**4. Any engineering difficulties encountered in constructing the project;**

The terrain continues to challenge SDG&E's determination of final structure locations. However, the engineering difficulties have not currently caused any change in cost, scope, or schedule.

**5. Total estimated project costs;**

The total estimated cost of the project remains unchanged at \$1.883 billion.

**6. Actual spending to date;**

The actual project spending through the end of the second quarter 2009 (6/30/09) is \$156 million.

**7. Any and all filings submitted to FERC for ultimate cost recovery through transmission rates; and**

No such filings have been submitted to date.

**8. Any additional information SDG&E believes relevant and necessary to accurately convey the status of the Sunrise project.**

**a. SDG&E-Citizens Energy agreement**

SDG&E and Citizens Energy reached a development and coordination agreement on May 11, 2009. This agreement is the result of discussions that follow from an earlier memorandum of agreement ("MOA") regarding joint participation in the project, which was executed in 2006.<sup>4</sup> Under the agreement, Citizens would lease 50% of the transfer capability of the Sunrise

Powerlink from the Imperial Valley substation to the Imperial/San Diego County line for a term of 30 years. Citizens agrees to turn over operational control of that capacity to the California Independent System Operator (“CAISO”), apply to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) for Participating Transmission Owner (“PTO”) status and to charge rates substantially similar to the rate SDG&E could recover if SDG&E constructed Sunrise without Citizens’ participation. Citizens’ transfer capability will revert back to SDG&E at the end of the thirty year lease. SDG&E will file an application with the Commission under Section 851 of the Public Utilities Code for approval of the development and coordination agreement with Citizens. SDG&E will not record in ratebase an amount equal to the lease payment. The agreement does not change SDG&E’s renewable energy commitments, SDG&E’s customers should be indifferent to the arrangement, and Citizens agrees to invest at least 50% of its profits from the agreement in low-income programs in the Imperial Valley.

**b. Import Limitation at Miguel Substation**

Currently, imports into Miguel substation can be limited by the amount of generation that is being produced by the TDM and Intergen generators in Mexico. Low levels of generation restrict the amount of power that can be imported into Miguel substation because there is less generation that can be tripped—via a Special Protection Scheme (“SPS”)—in the Imperial Valley to mitigate an overload of one 500/230 kV transformer at Miguel substation for the loss of the other transformer.

In coordination with the CAISO, IID, CFE, and APS, SDG&E has modified the existing Special Protection Scheme (SPS) to eliminate the need to limit imports into Miguel substation when the output of the TDM and Intergen plants is low. With the modified SPS, the maximum

level of imports into Miguel substation will be 1800 MW, regardless of how much power the TDM and Intergen plants are producing.

The SPS modifications are expected to be in-service by July 25, 2009.

**c. Procurement activities**

Pre-construction activities such as procuring long-lead equipment, land right acquisition, environmental surveys, and detailed engineering design are moving forward in order to meet the construction start date.

SDG&E has recently executed the procurement contract for underground cable manufacturing for the Alpine Boulevard underground portion of the project. The first group of the lattice tower orders for a quantity of 204 towers was also released for manufacture. These are long lead time commitments that are necessary to allow construction of the project to be fully completed by June 2012. Additionally, SDG&E signed a contract for the purchase of a heavy lift helicopter (S64 Air Crane). The purchase was necessary in order to ensure availability of this helicopter during construction of Sunrise. Due to the unique features that make it ideal for fire fighting and installation of structures on transmission projects, the short supply of air cranes are often committed to agencies and utilities.

SDG&E opened a new office in the Imperial Valley on May 5, 2009, for the purposes of further promoting development of renewable resources in the Imperial Valley region, as well as serving as a local project office for the Sunrise Powerlink.

**d. Community outreach and environmental mitigation**

SDG&E has organized open houses in communities along the approved southern route. Also, the plan for acquiring land for environmental mitigation is proceeding with specific identification of lands that meet all criteria for mitigation of impacts. This plan was submitted on

June 1, 2009, for review and approval by the relevant agencies, including the CPUC, BLM, U.S. Forest Service, U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, CA Dept. of Fish & Game, City and County of San Diego, and the Endangered Habitat League.
