The parties’ time allocations include any time that may be necessary for responding to Commissioner’s questions during their presentations. Parties should plan accordingly.

In order to avoid the inadvertent loss of time due to technical difficulties, parties may not use PowerPoint projections or other overhead projections. Parties may distribute handouts or use briefing boards subject to the following conditions:

1. Parties must distribute copies of all handouts or briefing boards to the other parties no later than 2 p.m. on the day before the oral argument.
2. Parties shall bring copies of handouts and briefing boards (in reduced format) sufficient for the Commissioners and others attending the oral argument.
3. Handouts for the Commissioners must be distributed prior to the call to order in order to minimize delay in the oral argument.
4. Handouts and briefing boards must include citations to record evidence clearly supporting any factual assertions. Record evidence includes the transcript and exhibits admitted into the formal record by ruling of the administrative law judge; it does not include information or documentation that may have been presented in ex parte communications.
5. All pages and points should be numbered for ease of reference and to facilitate an understanding of the resulting transcript.
6. Handouts and briefing boards will not be received as exhibits.

The oral argument is set to adjourn by no later than 4 p.m.
