**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING  
REVISING THE TIMES FOR THE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION  
HEARING IN SEASIDE, CALIFORNIA**

On July 1, 2010, California-American Water Company (Cal Am) filed an application to increase revenues in the years 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014 for its seven districts.<sup>1</sup> Protests to Cal Am's application were timely received and a prehearing conference was noticed and held on August 20, 2010. An Assigned Commissioner's and Administrative Law Judge's Scoping Memo and Ruling was issued on September 24, 2010.

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<sup>1</sup> Special Request #3 of Cal Am's application seeks authority to rename six of its seven districts. The proposed changes are; San Diego County District (formerly Coronado District), Los Angeles County District (formerly Los Angeles District), Monterey County District (formerly Monterey District), Sacramento County District (formerly Sacramento District), and Ventura County District (formerly Village District). The Larkfield District is unchanged.

On December 27, 2010 an Administrative Law Judge's Ruling scheduling a series of Public Participation Hearings was issued. By ruling on January 20, 2011, a Public Participation Hearing was scheduled in Seaside, CA. This ruling revises the times for the Public Participation Hearing in Seaside, CA as follows:
