**ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING
ON SECOND AMENDMENT TO SCOPING MEMO RULING
REVISING PROCEEDING SCHEDULE**

This Second Amendment to Scoping Memo Ruling further revises the proceeding schedule. During the past several months, the Commission's Consumer Safety and Protection Division (CPSD) has been actively engaged in an ongoing effort to facilitate discussion and/or dialogue amongst all parties in this proceeding.

I am advised by CPSD that the discussions have been productive, and some, maybe all, of the parties in this proceeding is nearing a potential settlement agreement concerning some, or all, of the proposed general order provisions. I am also advised that there will soon be a settlement conference noticed and held in compliance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, Article 12 (Article 12). To allow the parties adequate time to finish the above efforts and to comply with Article 12 timeline, I find that the proceeding schedule should be further revised. Accordingly, just and good cause shown, the proceeding schedule is further revised as follows:
