ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S RULING CORRECTING ERROR IN RULING PROVIDING GUIDANCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF DIRECT PARTICIPATION RULES, FORMS, AND REQUIREMENTS

On February 17, 2011 Administrative Law Judge Darwin E. Farrar issued a ruling providing guidance for the development of direct participation rules, forms, and requirements. The section of the ruling that addresses registration and other consumer protection rules for Demand Response Providers (DRPs) contains two incorrect references. First, the reference to agricultural customers shown in the section below is incorrect.

- The requirements for registration at the CPUC that are applicable to DRPs that solicit residential and small commercial/agricultural customers (including the definition of small commercial and agricultural customers), and a list of required documents (i.e. CPUC registration form, proof of valid CAISO registration, proof of financial responsibility, and etc.).

Rather than refer to "agricultural" customers, this section should refer to industrial customers. As modified, this section should read as follows:

- The requirements for registration at the CPUC that are applicable to DRPs that solicit residential and small commercial and industrial customers (including the definition of small commercial and industrial customers), and a list of required documents (i.e. CPUC registration form, proof of valid CAISO registration, proof of financial responsibility, and etc.).

Also, the reference to bundled customers shown in the section below is incorrect.

- Identification of separate, less onerous, registration requirements for bundled customers.

Rather than refer to “bundled” customers, this section should refer to large commercial and industrial customers. As modified, this section should read as follows:

- Identification of separate, less onerous, registration requirements for large commercial and industrial customers.

IT IS RULED that:

1. The changes above will be incorporated into the February 17, 2011 ruling providing guidance for the development of direct participation rules, forms, and requirements.
