Summary: AUGMENTATION REQUIRED. On November 18, 2005, Colin E. Cushnie, Director of Regulatory Affairs of Southern California Edison Company (SCE), met with Brian Prusnek, advisor to Cmmr. Kennedy. Written material (attached to the notice) was used.
