Written material (attached to the notice) was used. Pocta, Lee and Kinosian explained that DRA opposed the request of Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) to implement the Firm Access Rights (FAR) proposal, because FAR is unnecessary, unduly complex, would decrease customer flexibility, increase costs, and appears inconsistent with Federal Energy Regulatory Commission precedent regarding access charges. Clark and Nanjo explained that DGS also opposed the request of SoCalGas and SDG&E. Pedersen explained that the FAR proposal posed the risk of decreasing market liquidity and increasing prices for generators in southern California.
