Cherry stated that the proposed decision in the Cost of Capital proceeding failed to account for the increased risk PG&E faces in today's capital markets. Cherry argued for a higher ROE by noting that PG&E would be investing upwards of \$15 billion of capital in utility infrastructure over the next 5 years and that it would exceed its rate base forecast of investment in 2008. Cherry also discussed PG&E's debt issuance of over \$700 million earlier this year and stated that the company would issue up to \$2 billion in new debt over the next 18 months.

Summary: On November 7, 2007 Mike Florio of The Utility Reform Network (TURN) met with Matthew Deal, advisor to Pres. Peevey in San Francisco. Also present were Andrew Schwartz, advisor to Pres. Peevey; Jaclyn Marks, advisor to Cmmr. Simon; Robert Kinoshian, advisor to Cmmr. Bohn; Andrew Campbell, advisor to Cmmr. Chong; Barbara Barkovich of the California Large Energy Consumers Association (CLECA); Jennifer Chamberlin of Strategic Energy; Brett Franklin of the Electricity Oversight Board; Aaron Johnson, Deputy Director of the Division of Ratepayer Advocates (DRA); Fred Mobasheri of Electric Power Group, consultant for DRA; and Karin Paull and Charlyn Hook of DRA. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Cherry stated that the proposed decision in the Cost of Capital proceeding failed to account for the increased risk PG&E faces in today's capital markets. Cherry argued for a higher ROE by noting that PG&E would be investing upwards of \$15 billion of capital in utility infrastructure over the next 5 years and that it would exceed its rate base forecast of investment in 2008. Cherry stated that the risk to utilities regarding this level of incremental investment was large and that for every \$100 million increase in rate base from authorized levels, PG&E would need a 10 basis point adjustment just to stay even with its ability to earn its authorized ROE.

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
