**Communications Division's Proposed California High  
Cost Fund – B (CHCF-B) Expense Budget for FY 2009-2010**

Pursuant to Article 4.1. (a) of the Charter of the California High Cost Fund – B Administrative Committee (CHCF-B AC), the CHCF-B AC is charged to submit a proposed expense budget for the fiscal year 2009-10 by June 1, 2008.

Although we were unable to meet the June 1<sup>st</sup> due date, the CHCF-B AC met on June 24 to discuss the budget and other program matters. Because of conflict of interest issues for some AC members, we were unable to have a quorum to officially approve this budget. We are however, sending you the Communications Division's proposed expense budget so that the public will have an opportunity to review and comment on it.

Public Utilities Code Section 739.3 which authorizes the CHCF-B program is scheduled to sunset on January 1, 2009, the middle of the fiscal year, unless extended by future legislation. The legislature is currently considering SB 780 which would extend the CHCF-B program until January 1, 2013. The budget assumes expenses for the entire fiscal year because the Legislature may extend the program.
