Pursuant to the Assigned Commissioner's Ruling and Scoping Memo, filed January 6, 2009, the Commission's Consumer Protection and Safety Division (CPSD) will be conducting a two-day workshop in order to propose to the Commission clarifications or additional rules designed to reduce fire hazards involving electric lines or communications facilities near

electric lines, so that these measures can be adopted and implemented by autumn, 2009. The workshop will focus on proposed rules submitted by CPSD and other parties on January 21, 2009 addressing: (1) immediate reporting of fire related incidents and full cooperation with Commission staff; (2) applying General Order (GO) 165 or similar maintenance and inspection requirements to all communication infrastructure providers and electric transmission facilities; (3) pole overloading; (4) prompt reporting and resolution of violations discovered by pole tenants; (5) vegetation management in high fire risk areas and (6) mitigating high speed wind dangers.
