**NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY**

[Draft Resolution T-17330](#): Verizon California Inc. (U-1002 C) requests authority to deviate from Public Utilities Code Section 320 requiring undergrounding of aerial facilities along Scenic Highway 395 in Mono County.

The following resolution will be on the agenda of the Commission's July 28, 2011, meeting:

Resolution T-17330, if adopted, will approve Verizon California's Inc. request for a deviation in accordance with

Public Utilities Code Section 320 conditional upon:

- Submission of a plan for future compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 320;
- Payment of a fine in the amount of \$5,000; and
- Application to the California Advanced Services Fund for a grant to add facilities to provide broadband services to Swall Meadows and Crowley Lake.

On July 28, 2011, the Commission may vote on this resolution, or it may postpone a vote until later. When the Commission votes on a draft resolution, it may adopt all or part of it as written, amend, or modify it, or set it aside and prepare a different resolution. Only when the Commission acts does a resolution become binding on the parties. The conformed resolution, when adopted by the Commission, is available at the same website.

Pursuant to Public Utilities (PU) Code 311 (g), the draft resolution is available for public comments. Comments should be focused on factual, legal, and/or technical errors in the draft resolution. Comments must be limited to five pages in length and shall include a subject index listing the recommendations to the draft resolution, a table of authorities, and an appendix setting forth the proposed revised findings and ordering paragraphs.

If you wish to be served by parties filing opening and reply comments, please inform the Communications Division, Project Management and Implementation Branch, of the California Public Utilities Commission by July 6, 2011, of your request by e-mail to [lpp@cpuc.ca.gov](mailto:lpp@cpuc.ca.gov) Otherwise, comments on Draft Resolution T-17330 will be addressed only to the Communications Division as stated below.

The date of submission is the date the comments are received by the Communications Division. Parties must serve a copy of their comments to each requesting party, if any, as set forth on the

Commission web-site on the same date that the comments are submitted to the Communications Division. The requesting party list, if any, will be available on the Commission website at <http://www.cpuc.ca.gov/PUC/Telco/Public+Programs/Advisory+Boards/chcfaac.htm> on July 6, 2011.

Comments must be submitted no later than 5:00 pm on July 12, 2011. Reply comments must be submitted no later than 5:00 pm on July 18, 2011 and shall be limited to identifying misrepresentations of law, fact, or condition of the record contained in the comments of other parties. Replies shall not exceed five pages in length and shall be submitted and served in the same manner as opening comments.

Late-filed opening comments and/or reply comments will ordinarily be rejected. However, in extraordinary circumstances, a request for leave to submit comments or replies late may be filed together with proposed comments/replies. An accompanying declaration under penalty of perjury shall be submitted setting forth all the reasons for the late submission.
