**Pursuant to Public Utilities Code § 399.8, directs Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and San Diego Gas & Electric Company, to collect monies from customers to fund investments in energy efficiency, renewable energy and research development, and demonstration projects.**
