**Summary:** On November 24, 2003, Lee Schavrien, Vice President of Regulatory Affairs, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) and Southern California Gas Company (together, the Sempra Energy Utilities (SEU)), met with Julie Fitch, advisor to Pres. Peevey, in San Francisco. Also present was Billy Blattner, SEU CPUC Relations Manager. Schavrien stated that SDG&E interprets AB 1 to apply to SDG&E's commodity rate. Schavrien explained that the proposed decision (PD) would move away from cost causation and could increase cost shifting for ten to twenty years. Blattner added that conclusions in the PD about prior rate changes are outside the scope of this proceeding and that affected customers were not properly noticed that such changes would be considered.

**Summary: LATE FILED.** On November 20, 2003, Andrea Weller of Strategic Energy, on behalf of the Alliance for Retail Energy Markets (AREM), met with David Gamson, advisor to Cmmr. Brown, in San Francisco. Also present was Mona Petrochko of Constellation Energy, on behalf of AREM. Weller and Petrochko discussed the direct access (DA) load growth petition for modification and the possibility of a revised version of the original draft decision, and voiced support for the latest version issued by the Energy Division. Weller expressed concern about DA customers not receiving a credit for the reduction in the Department of Water Resources Revenue Requirement, and regarding DA customers getting credit for the amounts already contributed toward Pacific Gas and Electric Company's historical procurement charges.
