Robinson reminded the Commission of the history that resulted in the Commission setting interim UNE rates for Verizon based upon UNE rates adopted by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities. Robinson noted that the NJBPU is reexamining the depreciation and cost of capital utilized in computing Verizon New Jersey's UNE rates. Robinson stated that if the NJBPU makes changes to these critical cost components used in computing the New Jersey UNE rates then fairness dictates that Verizon's interim UNE rates in California should be adjusted accordingly.
