Summary: On May 25, 2004, Alvin S. Pak, Director, Regulatory Policy & Analysis for Sempra Energy Global Enterprises, on behalf of Sempra Energy Resources (SER), met with Cmmr. Kennedy in San Francisco. Also present were Brian Prusnek, advisor to Cmmr. Kennedy, and William Engelbrecht, Vice President of Energy Supply for SER. Written material (attached to the notice) was used. Engelbrecht and Pak conveyed SER's support for Cmmr. Peevey's alternate decision (AD) and noted that the AD is the only pending decision that addresses the issue of maintaining the tax interests of the City of Escondido and that it correctly finds that the contract between SER and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) is in the public interest.
