C04-06-037 – Amcor Sunclipse North America vs. Pacific Bell dba SBC California, for the following Findings and Orders: 1. That effective May 17, 2001 Complainant and Defendant entered into a two-year Service Agreement; 2. All necessary changes were made to the complainant’s PBX by the inception of the contract in order to PIC defendant as the carrier for Local Toll services; 3. Defendant had authority to properly route the traffic but failed to perform and make the necessary changes at its central office; 4. Defendant failed to perform under the agreement by not providing notice of the revenue shortfall after twelve (12) months and is therefore not entitled to recover the sum of \$78,082., or any amounts from Complainant; 5.
