Kennedy, in San Francisco. Zafar summarized the hearings and stated that the Commission should look beyond what "could have been." Zafar stated that SoCalGas Acquisition entered the winter season with 59.4 Bcf of physical gas storage which equaled to 85% of its physical inventory and that, in comparison, the rest of the US averaged 83% and the noncore customers filed just 12% (excluding SDG&E) of their storage capacity. Zafar stated that Edison's allegations are baseless and provide no new evidence.
