Any possible right that any party to Docket Nos. A02-11-017 and I03-01-012 may have to an evidentiary hearing on the matter that is the subject of this Draft Resolution will be waived if the party does not properly request such a hearing in its comments to be filed by December 6, 2004, which comments must include the above-required information.
