Summary: On February 23, 2006, Tony F. DiStefano, Chief Executive Officer of Arrival Communications, Inc., had a telephone conversation with Kelly Hymes, advisor to Cmmr. Grueneich. DiStefano discussed the draft decision (DD) on routine network modifications. DiStefano stated that the DD's conclusion that SBC should be allowed to impose additional charges on competitive local exchange carriers when SBC deploys repeaters and multiplexers was based on a misunderstanding of the Commission approach to TELRIC analysis in the UNE relook docket. DiStefano argued that to allow SBC to impose any additional charges for RNMs would violate both TELRIC principles and the Federal Communications Commission's prohibition against double recovery.
